Doug Ellis offers two starting times for this expedition: 4:30 AM for owling. The Willow Creek area is prime habitat for owls. Those that have been heard here on past trips are Northern Pygmy, Spotted, Screech, Great Horned and Sawwhet.

Those who prefer a later hour will meet at <u>8AM</u> for other landbirds, which might include Varied Thrushes and Hermit Thrushes, Winter Wrens and who knows what?

Meeting place for all is the <u>parking area in Occidental near Negri's Restaurant</u>. The trip will end at Jenner.

#### FIELD TRIP REPORTS

Four Eastern warblers made birding at Point Reyes on September 20 a roaring success! A Prothonotary Warbler at the Nunes Ranch, challenging the sunshine with his bright plumage, was a life bird for most of the observers. Also at the Nunes Ranch was an immature American Redstart, nervously fanning his yellow-patterned tail feathers. Down at the New Willows was an Ovenbird which did not light long enough for everyone to get a good look. At the Abandoned Ranch, on the way home, Betty Burridge spotted a Chestnut-sided Warbler with brilliant lime-green head and back, seen by a few lucky others.

Other highlighters for the day were a <u>Black Scoter</u> near the Fish Docks, a possible <u>Least Flycatcher</u> at the Lighthouse, and <u>Pectoral</u> and <u>Baird's Sandpipers</u> at the Spaletta Ranch farm pond. A <u>Ferruginous Hawk</u> flew over Nunes Ranch.

Mike Parmeter, assisted by Ruth Rudesill, led the group of 22 birders on this beautiful warm, sunny day. The total list of 80 species included:

9/14 - Doran Park pond: Pectoral Sandpiper (BDP)

9/16 - Bodega Bay: Arctic Tern, 15 Red Knots, Peregrine Falcon, Nashville Warbler (RM)

Highway 37 area

9/13 - Skaggs Island: 65 species, including Warbling Vireo, Black-throated Gray Warbler, Yellow Warbler, Common Merganser, Long-billed Curlews, and a Barn Owl roosting 5 feet away from 2 Great Horned Owls (DA, NSAS)

9/14 - Tubbs Island: 30 species, including 100 Long-billed Curlews, 200 Marbled Godwits, 200 American Avocets, 30 Black-crowned Night-herons, Ringnecked Pheasant (1 male, plus a female with a brood of 15 very young chicks) and a Peregrine Falcon wearing falconer's jesses...apparently, the bird which was lost in Petaluma. If you see a bird matching this description, please phone Dick Ashford. (DA)

8/29 - Channel Drive: Wood Ducks (4 adults, 9 imm.) (B&BR)

9/8 - Annadel State Park: 2 Pileated Woodpeckers (FB)

??? - Calistoga Road: Cedar Waxwings, Hermit Thrush (JA)

Other

8/3 - Cader Lane ponds, Petaluma: 4 Wilson's Phalaropes, 1 Spotted Sandpiper in breeding plumage, 2 Lesser Yellowlegs (BDP)

8/9 - Mt. Pinos vicinity: 3 California Condors (the final 3 remaining in the wild. DN)

- Chincopin. Yosemite N.P.: Barn Owl heard - believed to be one of the highest elevations (6,000 feet) that this species has been recorded (DN)
