December 21, Sunday - SANTA ROSA CHRISTMAS COUNT

This is the 27th for Santa Rosa and RROS. Last year we set a new record for total species for the third consecutive year. We had 152. We hope to top that figure again this year. We will be covering Greater Santa Rosa, rain or shine.

A donation of \$3 is requested by National Audubon from each participant to help pay the cost of compiling and publishing the results. You may sign up at the December 11th General Meeting.

The Compilation and Potluck Supper will again be at the Wikiup Greens Clubhouse, thanks to Bob and Bertha Rains. Please bring something to share - soup, chili, sandwich fixings, dessert - whatever. You need NOT bring utensils - everything is there. Arrival time should be anytime after 5 PM. Final compilation will start around 6:30 PM.

To get there, take Hwy 101 north of Santa Rosa, exit on River Road (about 2 miles north of Coddingtown); head east to first stop sign (Old Redwood Hwy), turn north on Old Redwood Hwy about 1 mile, crossing bridge; take first right after bridge onto Wikiup Drive; proceed east about ½ mile; take right turn onto Las Casitas & then immediate left. Parking is on the left and up the street.

Doug says that area leaders for the Count will remain about the same, but there are a couple of openings for anyone who wants to lead a new area. And if you can't do the Count, plan to come to the Potluck Supper anyway. Hope to see everyone there!

FIELD TRIP REPORT

A Spotted Owl was the star of the show at Doug Ellis' November 16th field trip to Willow Creek Road. Five other hardy types met Doug in Occidental for the early morning owling and were well rewarded. After 45 minutes stumbling along Willow Creek Road's rutted surface in the dark, with Spotted Owls responding to Doug's calls from a distance, the six birders suddenly heard the barking call about 30 feet away. There it was, glaring at us in Doug's flashlight beam, in the low branches of a fir! The owl flew around the tree a bit while everyone got a good look at it...a Life Bird for several in the group.

As dawn broke, several of the Pygmy-Owls that had been answering Doug's calls appeared. During the day, the group saw 5 and heard 6. A pair of Pileated Woodpeckers were working away atop a snag during these early morning hours and allowed a fine view of them.

Other highlights included both Bald and Golden Eagles feeding on a sheep carcass. They provided a good lesson in identification of immatures. We also had a good look at a Cooper's Hawk, using the field mark advice given us by Dr. Stephen F. Bailey during the October program.

The trip ended abruptly on a sour note when lunch was interrupted by shooting nearby. Ducks suddenly arising from the thick trees along Willow Creek suggested the reason.

The 56 species seen for the day were as follows: Great Blue Heron, Wood Duck, Mallard, Turkey Vulture, Bald Eagle, Northern Harrier, Cooper's Hawk, Redtailed Hawk, Golden Eagle, American Kestrel, Sora, Ring-billed Gull, California Gull, Band-tailed Pigeon, Western Screech-Owl, Great Horned Owl, Northern Pygmy-Owl, Spotted Owl, Northern Saw-whet Owl, Anna's Hummingbird, Belted King-fisher, Acorn Moodpecker, Nuttall's Woodpecker, Hairy Woodpecker, Northern Flicker, Pileated Woodpecker, Black Phoebe, Steller's Jay, Scrüb Jay, Common Raven, Chestnut-backed Chickadee, Bushtit, Brown Creeper, Bewick's Wren, Winter Wren, Marsh Wren, Golden-crowned Kinglet, Ruby-crowned Kinglet, Western Bluebird, Hermit Thrush, American Robin, Varied Thrush, Wrentit, European Starling, Hutton's Vireo, Yellow-rumped Warbler, Townsend's Warbler, Rufous-sided Towhee, Brown Towhee, Fox Sparrow, Song Sparrow, Golden-crowned Sparrow, White-crowned Sparrow, Dark-eyed Junco, Brewer's Blackbird, Pine Siskin.
