May 23, Sat. , Field Trip to Gualala



Highlights included: Lesser Nighthawks near Sutter Buttes, Blue Grosbeaks and Lazuli Buntings in Yuba City, Swainson's Hawks soaring over fields, a pair of Blue-winged Teal and I Tundra Swan.... 
