FIELD TRIP REPORT

The shorebirds are flocking back to Bodega Bay. One skittish flight that lifted off the sandbar betrayed a Parasitic Jaeger, hard at work chasing a gull. The jaeger was a dark bird and close enough along the north shore to give everyone a good look.

Thirteen people turned out for this clear bright day, with Bob McLean leading the group. They spotted 91 species: 9/12/87

BIRDING NEWSLETTER INTRODUCED

Kurt Campbell has issued the first numbers of his new newsletter PICA, aimed at Northern California birding. The title refers to California's only endemic bird, the Yellow-billed Magpie. The next several issues will include articles on good birding spots, how-to articles on birding techniques and note taking. Kurt plans to include articles on new identification marks and news of special interest to birders.

BREEDING BIRD ATLAS UPDATE

The Breeding Bird Atlas project has turned up the first breeding records in Sonoma County for Great Egret and Yellow-rumped Warbler.

The Sonoma County Breeding Bird Atlas Committee met at Coordinator Betty Burridge's house on September 11. The field season is essentially over, and field cards should be turned in. Those who have done atlasing may be receiving telephone calls regarding some sightings and a request for further information.

The committee will be working at weekly meetings to organize and screen data, file information on volunteers, the blocks covered, and on what private property permission has been granted to enter and collect data.

Betty would like more birders to consider working for the Breeding Bird Atlas. Four visits to an assigned block would be acceptable coverage to start atlasing. The major field season is April - August, but breeding records for some species may be gathered in other months.

Call Betty Burridge (527-0225) if you can help. The Atlas is for identification and, if you are lucky, observation of nest building, occupied nests and young.
