COMING ATTRACTIONS

December 10, Thursday, 7:30 PM - General Meeting

"Bring Your Own Slides Night" has become a popular tradition for RROST December meeting...a time to show off your best shots! Please sort through your camera work for this past year and bring about 10 slides to share with the rest of us. We will enjoy them together. If you have more slides you would like to show, and we have time, we will see them.

December 20, Sunday - SANTA ROSA CHRISTMAS COUNT

Coming up is RROS' 28th Santa Rosa Christmas Count. We will be covering Greater Santa Rosa, rain or shine. We hope to better - by far! - last year's count of 136 species, the lowest Santa Rosa had produced in many years. In 1985 we had set a record of 152 species, the third consecutive year for breaking a previous record. So we wondered what happened in 1986.

Studies by Point Reyes Bird Observatory biologists indicated that land birds in their Palomarin area experienced massive reproductive failure following the Chernobyl nuclear power plant catastrophs in Russia in spring 1986. PRBO statistics showed that the nestling failure, which occurred over much of Northern California, coincided with local rain showers on May 6, 1986, when a cloud of radioactive particles from the accident was passing over coastal Washington, Oregon and Northern California. Since PR80 has found that landbird productivity in 1987 is back to normal, we can anticipate that RROS Christmas Count will be back to normal...that is, better than ever!

Doug Ellis will be the Coordinator. If you would like to participate and are not already assigned to a team, please phone him at work, 585-0226; or drop him a note at PO Box 155, Eldridge 95431. National Audubon this year is requesting scaled donations: \$4 for the first Christmas Count of your year, \$3.50 for the second, and \$3 for the third count you participate in, and thereafter. This will help pay the cost of compiling and publishing count results.

The Compilation and Potluck Supper will again be at the Wikiup Greens Clubhouse, courtesy of Bob and Bertha Rains. Please bring something to share - soup, chili, sandwich fixings, dessert or salad. You need NOT bring utensils: everything is there. Arrival time should be anytime after 5 PM. Final compilation will start around 6:30 PM.

To get there: take Hwy 101 north of Santa Rosa, exit on River/Mark West Springs Road (about 2 miles north of Coddingtown); head east to first stop sign (Old Redwood Hwy), turn north on Old Redwood Hwy about one mile, crossing bridge; take first right after bridge onto Wikiup Drive; proceed east about ½ mile; take right turn onto Las Casitas and then immediate left. Parking is on the left and up the street. Hope to see everyone there!

FIELD TRIP RESULTS

Three early risers joined Doug Ellis for the Willow Creek owling expedition on November 14: Betty Burridge, Roger Marlowe and Sherryl Royce. Setting forth from Occidental at 4:30 in the morning, they stumbled as silently as possible down the rutted mountain road, while Doug spoke to the owls. They heard responses from Spotted, Saw-whet, Screech-owl, Great Horned and Northern Pygmy-owl. The birds did not appear.

At eight o'clock, the group was joined by Dr. Jack Arnold, Frances Kohn, June Persson, Bob and Bertha Rains and another friend of the Rains. Around 43 birds were seen during the sunny, cool day, including Band-tailed Pigeons and Varied Thrush.
