
Field Trip: Ida Clayton Road April 30, 1988

Field Trip: King's Ridge Road May 14, 1988



The wish birds for this trip were the Dipper and Pygmy Owl. both of which were seen early in the day. Doug Ellis led the group on to sight 75 species. An obliging Pileated Woodpecker hammered away for 15 or 20 minutes while observers had excellent views of this handsome bird at close range. The Blue Grouse was heard by many, but seen only by a few.
