Field Trip Report - Point Reyes, September 24

Twenty-six birders joined Terry Babineaux, leader, on an overcast day at Point Reyes. Some of the group glimpsed the Bobolink fly by at Nunes Ranch and all saw the only eastern warbler there - a Magnolia. A cooperative Willow Flycatcher at the Fish Docks repeatedly returned to a low perch for 15-20 minutes, allowing a large group to sit and watch tail flicking and to check out finer field marks. At the Abandoned Ranch, a Ferruginous Hawk was seen. Species seen were:
