#### COMING ATTRACTIONS

## January 7, Saturday - Field Trip to Bolinas Lagoon

This trip was announced in the December Kite Tales, as it will be before the January general meeting. The information is repeated for those who may have mislaid their Kite Tales during the holidays - and for many- the Christmas Bird Count rush. Dick Ashford, leader, will scout the area when he volunteers for the Southern Marin CBC the week before with Bob Stewart. He plans to locate the target bird for the day, the Sharp-tailed Sparrow, and any other rare or uncommon species. On this trip last year, a Black-legged Kittiwake flew close by while the group was eating lunch. No promises for a repeat performance, but you never know!

Audubon Canyon Ranch

Allow  $1\frac{1}{4}$  hours travel time from Santa Rosa. From Hwy. 101, take the Washington St. exit in Petaluma, proceed west.

Turn left at the library or at the signal for Lakeville Hwy., go one long block to D St., right on D and continue west through town. road will take you to Pt. Reyes Station where it meets Hwy 1. There you turn left and head south until you reach Audubon Canyon Ranch on the east side on Bolinas Lagoon.

Waterproof boots are recommended when combing the Bolinas marsh for the Sharp-tailed Sparrow and such. Bring along lunch and expect a great birding day.

## January 12, Thursday, 7:30 p.m. - General Meeting

Dr. Peter Connors will present the evening's program entitled: "Golden Plovers in Alaska: Cryptic Species Revealed". He will show slides and offer evidence in favor of splitting the Lesser Golden Plover into 2 species. Dr. Connors has been a museum scientist at the Bodega Marine Biology Laboratory since 1971. He did field research on shorebirds in Alaska during 11 summers. In recent years he has focused on taxonomy and behavior of Golden Plovers.

Come and learn to identify both dominica and fulva subspecies so you may be prepared to add another bird to your list when and if the two are split.

# November 25, 1988 - Sacramento Valley and Sierra Foothills

This field trip was sponsored by the Davis Audubon Society. However, as RROS members were invited by Terry Colborn, and as some of our members did go, results of the trip are reported here. Thank you, Ruth Rudesill for providing the information.
