FIELD TRIP REPORT

Saturday, February 11 - Sonoma Coast and Salmon Creek

Only five birders braved the cold, windy coast on the trip that started slowly with the usual birds in small numbers. As it was very windy at Willow Creek, the leader, Doug Ellis, decided to try Salmon Creek for the evening owling. The group was rewarded with excellent views of a friendly Saw-whet Owl, the first Doug had seen in Sonoma County. A total of 10 Saw-whets, 2 Spotted Owls, 2 West-ern Screech Owls and 1 Northern Pygmy were heard during the evening walk.


