May 20, Saturday - Field Trip to Wantrup Wildlife Sanctuary

Meeting Place: Bailey Field for car pooling Wantrup Wildlife Sanctuary Wantrup Wildlife Sanctuary, located in Pope Valley, is maintained by the Napa Land Trust. It is not normally open to the public, but our leader, Mike Rippey, has obtained special permission for our visit. Mike is an expert birder and very familiar with the area.

Mike is one of the folks working on the fledgling Napa-Solano Breeding Bird Atlas, and promises us an interesting day of birding. Wantrup has a varied habitat -- oak savannah, chapparal, grasslands, and even some ponds.

After we've fully explored this new (to us) area, we will have several options: Lake Berryessa, Las Posadas State Park, Lake Hennessey, or Bothe-Napa State Park. Each of these areas offers something different, and in some cases we will see birds that do not normally occur in our area.

For those with the time and energy, Mike is leading another trip that evening for the Napa-Solano Audubon Society. It will be an owling trip, preceded by a potluck supper and some breeding bird atlasing at Bothe-Napa State Park, and RROS members are invited.

Directions: From Santa Rosa, take Calistoga Rd. to Hwy 29. Proceed south on Hwy 29 to Deer Park Rd., turning left (east) toward Angwin. Deer Park Rd. becomes Howell Mt. Rd.; take it through Angwin. In approximately 4 miles, the road loops to the right, becoming Chiles & Pope Valley Rd. Proceed about 1 mile, turning left on Pope Canyon Rd. One more mile, and you will come to Hardin Rd., where there is a small airport. Turn right on Hardin Rd. (a dead end road). Follow this road for a couple of

miles to the sanctuary, where Mike will meet us at the gate.

FIELD TRIP REPORT Tennessee Valley, Marin County April 16, 1989

We six had an invigorating 3 mile walk through this lush green valley on a cool, windy and very overcast day. Lots of colorful wildflowers were blooming - especially beautiful were the wild iris in many subtle hues, the purple lupine, and the bright red Indian paint brush.

Forty common local breeding bird species were seen. Star of the show was a male red-winged blackbird who gave a new meaning to the word "dashing" with a dazzling and passionate display with his fancy red epaulets for the lucky, though somewhat indifferent, lady love.

Of note was a sighting by John McDonagh of a mountain lion near the main trail. The ranger told us that other such reports had all been at times other than during full daylight.
