FIELD TRIP REPORT Wantrup Sanctuary - Pope Valley May 20, 1989

Mike Rippy, a co-coordinator of the Napa-Solano Breeding Bird Atlas, led seven birders on a hike up the hill at Wantrup Sanctuary. The day was warm and clear, and there were many wildflowers out as well as birds. After the walk during which we saw 38 species, the local biologist invited the group to lunch in his back yard under a 200 year old oak tree. The bird of the day was a male Lawrence's Goldfinch.

Yosemite and Mono Lake

Ruth Rudesill reports that birds seen on the June 23-25 trip to Yosemite and Mono Lake with Doug Ellis and Roger Marlowe included Blue Grouse, Great Gray and Flammulated Owls, Common Nighthawk, White-headed Woodpecker, Williamson's Sapsucker, Black-headed Woodpecker, Red-breasted Sapsucker, Gray Flycatcher, Hammond's Flycatcher, Townsend's Solitaire, Hermit and MacGillivray's Warblers, Vesper and Lincoln's Sparrow, and Pine Grosbeak. On August 4th, Bob and Bertha Rains saw a Sage Thrasher on the tufas at Mono Lake.

European Birding

Dick Ashford, on an inexpensive pelagic trip off Wales spotted thousands of Razorbills, Common Murres, Atlantic Puffins, and Black-legged Kittiwakes.

Ruth Rudesill on her trip to six countries in Europe this spring sighted 83 species, including 60 life birds. Three of the lifers (Lapwing, Grey Heron, and Black Kite) were seen behind the Iron Curtain in East Germany.
