FIELD TRIP REPORT

Point Reyes - October 8

On a sunny, fall day, thirteen birders found 114 species at Point Reyes. Starting at White House Pool where a Swamp Sparrow was seen, to the Fish Docks where the King Eider was still to be found, many of the Point Reyes specialties were spotted. There were 5 Lesser Golden Plovers in the RCA field - 1 dominica, 2 fulva, 2 unid. - and later, 7 more at Spaletta Plateau. Also at the plateau were 2 Longspurs. At Horseshoe Pond, cooperative Lesser and Greater Yellowlegs fed together at the nearby shore. Four late Baird's Sandpipers were also there with a lone Pectoral. Among the ducks was an Eurasian Wigeon. Mike Parmeter, leader, added 2 species to his Outer Point Reyes List: Hairy Woodpecker and Greater Scaup (Outer Pt. Reyes starts just past Johnson's Oyster turnoff).
