Shiloh Regional Park is a new county park dedicated this spring. Directions: Take the

the Shiloh exit from Hwy. 101, proceed east

to the end of the road, take a very short jog right. The entrance to the park is on the left. There is a \$1 parking fee, or free for Gold Cards. For dinner, bring your own service and a main dish, salad or dessert. For the Owl Walk, confortable shoes and a flashlight are recommended. Wine and beer are permitted, but please comply with the county ordinance prohibiting styrofoam.

Shiloh Regional Park is foothill area with oak woodland, chapparal, some open fields, conifers, and a pond. Bob and Bertha Rains saw 48 species of birds there this spring, and heard Pygmy and Western Screech Owls. The park is to be maintained as a natural area with hiking and horseback riding only permitted.
