## FIELD TRIP REPORT Saturday, October 13 - Limantour

Offshore there were hundreds of gulls, and chasing them, at least 3 Parasitic Jaegers. A Red-necked Grebe and a Common Murre were there and a Snowy Plover was on the beach. At Muddy Hollow, the Eurasian Wigeon was spotted among a large number of ducks. On Inverness Ridge, a feeding flock provided good sightings of a Hermit Warbler and the first Varied Thrush for some in the group. Dan Nelson, trip leader, called attention to Red Crossbills flying over.



were: Laysan Albatross and many Black-footed Albatross, Northern Fulmar,
Pink-footed, Flesh-footed, Buller's and Sooty Shearwaters, Red and
Red-necked Phalaropes, Pomarine Jaeger, many Bonaparte's Gulls, and three
Sabine's Gulls.

Also seen were an Elephant Seal, and about ten Blue and Humpback Whales.
