Birds of the Pribiloffs is the title of David Wimpheimer's program for the April meeting. The Pribiloffs, islands off Alaska, are considered prime birding sites as millions of birds nest there - puffins, cormorants, kittiwakes, fulmars, auklets and murres. The islands also support seals and sea lions, and 70% of the northern fur seals breed there. Wimpheimer is a naturalist from Marin County; he has compiled the Point Reyes Christmas Bird Count for the past three years.

They finally gave up when they saw a few snowflakes! They did see 4 Red-throated Loons in the channel and managed to spot a Sora. Even though the afternoon birders left, our faithful leader, Doug Ellis, and Ruth Rudesill were at Salmon Creek for evening owling and were joined by John Klobas. In an hour they found the 3 species listed below and were sure that they heard at least 3 Spotted Owls.

#### MEMBERSHIP REPORT

We now have 74 memberships, and 101 members. Most of us live in the North Bay counties, and many others within 80 miles of Rohnert Park. We are pleased to have several members who have moved to more distant parts and continue their interest in Sonoma County birds and birders. Ray and Nell McDuffey, charter members, now live in Portland, Oregon. Mark Delwiche, president 1988-89, moved to Las Vegas, New Mexico. Carmen Patterson of Ballwin, Missouri, kindly sent a copy of the Kite Tales to her friend Eugenia Larson of Hayward, who came to the January field trip and then joined. Laurence Binford of Glencoe, Illinois, is sorely missed at Christmas Count time. He would stake out 3 or 4 warblers in his favorite haunts - Bassignani's nursery and the Laguna - and do a bit of poaching to pick up those few extra species for the count each year.

Several new members have joined this year, and while we do not welcome each one by name in the Kite Tales, their interest and participation is greatly appreciated.



### Feeder Birds

This winter unusual numbers of birds and species have been reported at yard feeders. Sharp-shinned Hawks have been observed harrassing smaller birds with at least one Quail taken, and a Junco near miss. A Cooper's Hawk made daring swoops through narrow openings in shrubbery at one feeder. A Peregrine Falcon visited at another.

A Lincoln's Sparrow has been at one feeder, and Fox Sparrows and White-throated Sparrows have been frequent visitors at feeders of five members. While there has been a marked decrease in hummingbirds, especially Anna's, Barbara Murray in Oakmont recently had 4 Allen's and 5 Anna's at one time in the evening.

A Northern Oriole at Karen Nagel's feeder on March 10th was 13 days ahead of the earliest arrival date shown in <u>Birds of Sonoma County</u>. Betty Groce in Oakmont has had Pine Siskins coming regularly with 110 at one time.
