

#### **COMING ATTRACTIONS**

Potluck and General Meeting: September 12, 1991--Thursday, 6:00 PM

Place: Sugarloaf State Park

This is a change of meeting place announced to attendees at our last meeting (at Sugarloaf). The Shiloh Park is no longer available for evening meetings. There will be a short business meeting after the Potluck dinner. Bring your own service, drinks and a main dish, salad or dessert. Comfortable shoes and a flashlight are recommended if you wish to do some owling after the meeting. It should be recalled that there is a \$5.00 entrance fee (\$4 if one passenger is a senior). Carpooling is suggested.

Field Trip to Bodega Bay. Ruth Rudesill will lead this trip on <u>Sunday</u>, <u>September 15</u>. Meet at 8:00 AM at the rail ponds on the north side of the lagoon. Be sure to wear warm clothing in case of fog or rainy (we hope) weather. It can also be very chilly when the wind blows, especially on the Head.

Pelagic Field Trip from Fort Bragg (Noyo harbor). Sunday, October 6, 7:00 AM to 1:30 PM. Meet at Sportman's Dock, off N. Harbor Dr. where there is lots of free parking. #### FIELD TRIP REPORTS

## Report Of May 11, 1991 to Ida Clayton Road (North side of Mt. St. Helena)

Twenty two observers led by Dan Nelson recorded 66 species of birds. Highlights of the day included a flock of **Tricolored Blackbirds** near the intersection of Ida Clayton Road and Hwy 128, three **Golden Eagles** (visible at the same time), **Mountain Quail** (seen by many) and **Sage Sparrow**. Also of note were **N. Pygmy Owl**, **White-throated Swift**, **Pileated Woodpecker**, **Blue-gray Gnatcatcher**, **California Thrasher**, and **Black-throated**, **Townsend's** and **Hermit Warblers**. Alan Pierson (phone numbers, 942-0598 or 942-4761) of the Sugarloaf Ranch invited us to bird on the ranch during our next visit.

## Report Of May 24-27, 1991 to Lava Beds/Klamath Basin.

Ten observers enjoyed great weather for a weekend trip that resulted in 121 species recorded. Most of the group camped at the Lava Beds National Monument. Sunny mornings involved hiking with afternoons reserved for driving around the Tule Lake and Lower Klamath Wildlife Refuges. Highlights included amazing views of a Prairie Falcon nest with six nestlings primed for fledging at the Petroglyph Cliffs, great looks at Purple Martins and Violet-green Swallows; Western Grebes doing their rushing display, good looks at White-faced Ibis and soaring White Pelicans, a breeding plumaged Red Knot was a rare treat, good looks at Great-horned Owls, Mountain Bluebirds, Green-tailed Towhees, and Canada Geese families were also reported. Two observers were fortunate to see Pinyon Jays, and Pronghorn Antelopes were also seen. Participating were: Ruth Rudesill (leader), Doug Ellis, David Hofmann, Karen Murphy, Bob and Bertha Rains, Cindy, Shirley and Judy Young, and Alan Wight.

## Report of June 14-16, 1991 to Yosemite National Park area.

Six observers led by Ruth Rudesill were blessed with pleasant weather during the three days at Yosemite. The group camped outside the park at Middle Fork Campground on the Tuolumne River. Saturday they drove over Tioga Pass, and on Sunday went to Bridalveil Campground and the Yosemite Valley. Yosemite Falls were spectacular due to late rains. Highlights of the trip included a Great Gray Owl perched in daylight in a meadow at Crane Flat and Yellow -bellied Marmots and Pikas along Tioga Road. Pbservations included a N. Pygmy Owl (called in) being mobbed by other species, Pine Grosbeak and Williamson's Sapsucker (at Bridalveil), White-headed Woodpecker, Evening Grosbeak; and Willow, Hammond's, and Dusky Flycatchers. A total of 61 species were recorded. Participating were: Ruth Rudesill(leader), Doug Ellis, David Hofmann, Betty Groce, Phyllis Schmitt and Cindy Young.
