PHONE WHEEL

Presently the editor has received the names of eighteen members who wish to be on the phone wheel. The names are printed below in an order that gave some people options as to whom they would call or be called by. If you are not happy with the order, it can be changed in time for a final list for the January meeting. However, it is suspected that the phones will be ringing during this Xmas Count season, so please use it and observe the rules given here.

1. When you receive word of a rare or unusual bird, call the person whose name follows yours on the list (the last person calls the first).

- 2. Be sure to report the following information:
- a. The name of the bird, its specific location (including directions), and description such as age, sex, etc.
- b. The name of the person finding the bird, and the name of the person starting the wheel.
- 3. Should you reach an answering machine, leave a short message so that person can call back for details. Then call the next person on the list. Repeat until you reach a person who can continue the alert and everyone can then be notified.
- 4. It would be a courtesy to phone someone who you were unable to reach at a later time, or relay that information to someone who could.

If you did not get on the list, find someone who is on it that would call you (in addition to the person they are honor bound to call on the phone wheel).

FIELD TRIP REPORTS

Report of Pelagic Field Trip to the Cordell Banks, November 3, 1991. The trip was led by Roger Marlowe and organized by Robin Leong. Participants included several members of RROS and members of the Napa-Solano and David Audubon societies. Visitors from Southern California included Kurt Campbell and Guy McCaskie. The weather was foggy and cold, but the sea was relatively calm. The trip list of 28 species follows:

Report of RROS Field Trip from Bodega Bay to Salmon Creek, November 23, 1991. Eleven birders led by Ruth Rudesill enjoyed a beautiful, sunny day of birding. Participants included Ted Eliot, David and Pam Fischer, Jack Arnold, Avid Anderson, Doug Ellis, David Hofmann, Alan Wight, Bob and Bertha Rains. 104 species were recorded featuring great looks at Virginia Rail and Sora, a Peregrin Falcon, a juvinile Tundra Swan (Doran Park), a Red Phalarope (on the beach) and an estimated 16,000 shorebirds at the Doran bayside tidal area.
