FIELD TRIP REPORTS

Report of field trip to Point Reyes on Sept. 12, 1992. The trip was led by David Hofmann substituting for Ruth Rudesill. Areas visited included the Lighthouse, Fish Docks, New Willows, Drakes Beach, Spaletta Plateau and Horseshoe Pond. The weather was foggy early on but cleared with sunshine and some wind later. Highlights included excellent views of two Parasitic Jaegers at the Fish Docks and one at Drake's Beach, several Pectoral Sandpipers at the Spaletta Plateau and Horseshoe Ponds, a Wilson's Phalarope at Horseshoe Pond, A Marbled Murrelet at the Fish Docks, and a Chestnut-sided Warbler at the Fish Dock trees. A number of observations outside our area were received and will be noted here as space permits. About nine RROS members journeyed to the Moss Landing State Beach on Sept. 19 and 20 where a Mongolian Plover and Wilson's Plover were both seen. The latter is very rare in California, while the former is rare anywhere is the US (except possibly Alaska). Ruth Rudesill (back with us again after a sojourn in the East) reported a Black Skimmer on 9/19 at Moss Landing Beach area in Monterey Co. This bird is rare this far north, but seen 2-3 times in Orange Co. this year by the editor. Alan Wight and Ruth Rudesill took a pelagic trip out of Monterey, and Ruth reports she saw more birds than she had ever seen before on a pelagic trip. Highlights of the trip were: 2 Sabine's Gulls, Black-footed Albatross, Least Storm-Petrel and about 3,000± Black-vented Shearwaters.
