FIELD TRIP REPORTS

Report of field trip on Sunday, November 15, 1992. The field trip began with owling on Willow Creek Road at 4:30 AM until sunup. After breakfast at Occidental, the group journeyed to Bodega Bay. At 12:15 they birded Willow Creek Rd on the Bridgehaven side to Occidental. At 3:30 PM they arrived at Santa Rosa Creek at Willowside Rd to look for the Tri-colored Heron which provided them with a fly-over at 4:45, presumably going to the Egret Roost on Marlowe at Guerneville Rd where the field trip ended at Sixteen observers were at Occidental at 4:30AM eager to owl. Doug Ellis called in a Western Scrleech Owl to be seen by all, and they also heard Spotted Owl, Northern Pygmy Owl, Saw-whet Owl and Great Horned Owl. A Barn Owl was later seen at a roost.

The weather was nearly perfect for owling: cold, still, partly cloudy and with a 3/4 moon. Report of field trip on Friday, November 27 (brief). Six RROS birders: Dick Ashford, Ted Eliot, David Hofmann, Ruth Rudesill, Wayne Tillay and Alan Wight; joined a group from Davis (and various other places) for an annual trip that includes: the area south of El Macero, Nimbus Dam, Bass Lake, the White Rock area and the Woodbridge Ecological Reserve. Although no extreme rarities were observed, about 80 species of birds were noted. 12 species of raptors were recorded, including Rough-legged Hawk, Ferruginous Hawk, Golden Eagle (doing a barrel roll when dive bombed by a Red-tail), Prairie Falcon and Merlin. Also of note were numbers of Lewis' Woodpeckers. However, the highlight of the day, thrilling all who were brave enough to endure the long (both in distance and time) trip, were thousands of Sandhill Cranes flying into and around the Woodbridge Ecological area just after sunset. SPECTACULAR!!!
