

Field Trip Reports

Palo Alto Baylands, December 12, 1993.

We went to the Baylands to observe rails at the extreme high tide. Several of us were lucky to see two Black Rails flush to cover. Clapper Rails were everywhere and easy to observe. There were several Sharp-tailed Sparrows but they were elusive. The highlight of the trip was a Yellow Rail that was flushed in front of most members of the group!!! A total of 72 bird species were encountered. Highlights included Redhead, Peregrine Falcon, Yellow Rail, Black Rail, Clapper Rail, Virginia Rail, Sora, Swamp Sparrow, and Sharp-tailed Sparrow.
