

Field Trip Reports

Lower Russian River Area, Sonoma County, February 6, 1994.

We woke up to pouring rain, but the rain stopped by the time the participants met. We birded the mouth of the Russian River, the Sonoma coast, up Willow Creek Road, and near Cazadero and Monte Rio. Highlight species included Yellow-bellied Sapsucker, Wood Duck, Black Scoter, Marbled Murrelet, Rhinoceros Auklet, Ferruginous Hawk, Swamp Sparrow, and Common Moorhen. The total number of species observed was 86. The participants were Doug Ellis, David Hofmann, Linda Petrulias, and Ruth Rudesill.

Klamath Basin Area, February 18-21, 1994.

We had a successful trip - the weather was cold with some snow flurries but much better than last year. We birded Lower Klamath and Tule Lake National Wildlife Refuges, Lava Beds National Monument, and the Fort Klamath/Klamath Falls areas. The highlights included thousands of geese and swans, 4 Trumpeter Swans (!), a Porcupine, and 100+ Bald Eagles.
