

Coming Attractions

Potluck Dinner and General Meeting. May 12, 1994 – Thursday, 6:00 PM at Spring Lake Park. Meet at the Lower Jackrabbit Picnic Area (use the Newanga Avenue entrance to the park). There will be a short business meeting after the potluck dinner. Bring your own service, drinks, and a main dish, salad, or dessert. Keep in mind that we will have to leave by sunset (approximately 8:00 PM).

Field Trip to Pine Flat Road. Saturday, May 14. Meet at 7:30 AM at the turnout approximately one quarter mile up Pine Flat Road. Take Alexander Valley Road from US 101 just north of Healdsburg to Highway 128. Go straight at Highway 128 to Pine Flat Road. We will look for a wide variety of woodland and chaparral species. Black-chinned Sparrow is a possibility. Leader is Dan Nelson (763-2754).

Field Trip to Yosemite. Friday, June 24 through Sunday, June 26. Jon Winter will be leading this trip to Yosemite National Park. This should be a very interesting trip due to Jon's extensive knowledge of the birds of the Yosemite area. Birds that will be looked for include Great Gray Owl, Williamson's Sapsucker, White-headed and Black-backed Woodpeckers, Hammond's and Dusky Flycatchers, and Pine and Evening Grosbeaks. We will bird near the Highway 120 entrance to the park and along Tioga Pass Road. A group camp for 30 people has been reserved at Moore Creek. Take Highway 120 toward Yosemite through Big Oak Flat and Groveland. Approximately 9 miles east of Groveland at Buck Meadows turn right onto Moore Creek Road. Drive south 1 to 2 miles to Moore Creek Group Site, where we will be camping on Friday, Saturday, and possibly Sunday nights. Lodging is available nearby at Evergreen Lodge near the park entrance ((209) 379-2606) or at Sugarpine Ranch Motel between Groveland and Buck Meadows ((209) 962-7823). Please contact Jon Winter at 528-7488 or Cindy Young at 585-8826 if you plan to go on this trip.

Field Trip to Lava Beds National Monument. Saturday, July 2 through Monday, July 4. We will be camping at the Lava Beds campground on Friday, Saturday, and Sunday nights. Among the many birds seen on past trips to Lava Beds are Prairie Falcon, Common Nighthawk, Purple Martin, Pinyon Jay, Canyon Wren, and Brewer's and Vesper Sparrows. Leader is Ruth Rudesill. Phone Wheel

The new phone wheel is printed below. Please follow the following rules when using the phone wheel.

- 1) When you receive word of a rare or unusual bird, call the person whose name follows your name on the list (the last person calls the first).
- 2) Report the following information:
 - a) Bird species (including age and sex information if relevant)
 - b) Location (including directions of how to get there if required)
 - c) When the bird was seen
 - d) Who found the bird
 - e) Who started the phone wheel
- 3) If you reach an answering machine, leave a short message so that the person can call back for details. Next call the following person on the list. Repeat until you reach a person who can pass on the information.
- 4) As a courtesy, try to phone the people you were unable to reach at a later time.

If you did not get on the list and would like to be alerted of rare birds, find someone on the wheel who would be willing to call you (in addition to the person on the phone wheel that they are responsible to call).

Field Trip Report

Fort Bragg Area, Mendocino County, April 17, 1994.

Fifteen birders enjoyed wonderful sunny weather and Dorothy Tobkin's able leadership. We birded along the train tracks at Pudding Creek, lunched at MacKerricher State Park, birded Mendocino Bay, hiked through Van Damme State Park, and ended the day on Cameron Road. A total of 95 bird species were encountered. Highlight species included Red-necked Grebe, Harlequin Duck, Wandering Tattler, Rhinoceros Auklet, and Gray Jay. Mono Lake Breeding Bird Count

On Saturday, June 11, 1994, there will be a breeding bird count at Mono Lake. The survey uses the Christmas count circle which is centered on Lee Vining. This circle includes much of the western shore of Mono Lake, as well as parts of Lundy and Lee Vining Canyons. In mid-June, birds should be at the height of song and activity. Abundant species include Green-tailed Towhees, Sage Thrashers, House Wrens, Redbreasted Sapsuckers, and Brewer's Sparrows. Much still needs to be learned about the avifauna of this beautiful area. Your help is crucial! The count is followed by a potluck at 6:00 PM at the Mono Lake County Park which is located on Cemetery Road about 4 miles north of Lee Vining.

Plan on a half to full day of hiking. Conditions are usually cold and windy. Participants need to have a working knowledge of the common birds, and bring food, water, and a clipboard. A spotting scope and 4WD vehicles could be useful. Contact Emilie Strauss at (510) 525-5761 for more information.
