



## Coming Attractions

General Meeting. Thursday, October 13 - 7:30 PM at Room 221, Darwin Hall, Sonoma State University. Debbie Shearwater will present a video and slides on life at sea - birds and cetacea. Debbie has led more than 1000 pelagic trips off the California coast over the past 18 years. She has done research on Blue Whales and on dolphins. Perhaps not as well known, she is an experienced land bird trip leader. She participated in the Monterey County Breeding Bird Atlas covering remote areas of the county. To pelagic birders Debbie is a familiar friend; to those who do not brave the seas, Debbie will bring the sea and its inhabitants to you. The parking fee at Sonoma State University is \$1.50. ## Fort Bragg Pelagic Trip, September 18, 1994.

The highlight species for this trip was Long-tailed Jaeger, which provided a first record for Mendocino County. Four Long-tailed Jaegers were seen, including one with full length central tail feathers. The species seen are listed below. The Mourning Dove was seen one hour out to sea and the Wilson's Warbler was seen one and a half hours out to sea. Also seen were Harbor Seal and Dall's Porpoise.
