

Coming Attractions

General Meeting. Thursday, November 10 - 7:30 PM at Room 221, Darwin Hall, Sonoma State University. Lynn Stafford will present his thesis study, Bird Distribution and Habitat Relationships in the Russian River Flood Plain Riparian Zones. This study is part of his Master's Degree in Biology program at Sonoma State University. Lynn has been an amateur naturalist for 45 years. After 22 years as a high school science and math teacher, Lynn began a field biology career five years ago. Since then he has worked for state agencies, for a wildlife consulting firm, and as an independent consultant. During this time, he has worked on Spotted Owl habitat studies, raptor mortality at wind power facilities, riparian restoration monitoring, and various natural napitat assessment projects.
