

Coming Attractions

General Meeting. Thursday, December 8 - 7:30 PM at Room 221, Darwin Hall, Sonoma State University. Dr. Charles Sibley will present the program entitled "Birds of the World on CD-ROM". Dr. Sibley was a professor at Cornell and Yale Universities and is now Adjunct Professor of Biology at Sonoma State. He was the president of the American Ornithologists' Union from 1986 to 1988. He has coauthored three books: Phylogeny and Classification of Birds, Distribution and Taxonomy of Birds of the World, and A World Checklist of Birds.

Field Trip Reports

Willow Creek Road, November 12, 1994.

Five eager participants woke up very early to accompany leader Doug Ellis on an owling trip in Willow Creek Canyon. They were rewarded with looks at Barn Owl, Great Horned Owl, and Northern Pygmy-Owl. They also heard Western Screech-Owl and Spotted Owl. After breakfast in Occidental, four other participants joined the trip. The weather was very nice and sunny. We went to Monte Rio, Duncan Mills, Jenner, Bridgehaven, and back up Willow Creek Canyon. Highlights of this portion of the trip included one female Hooded Merganser, an immature Golden Eagle, and Townsend's Warblers. Participants were Avis Anderson, Doug Ellis, Jeff Goodwin, David Hofmann, Jeff Holtzman, Mike Parmeter, Linda Petrulias, Ruth Rudesill, Alan Wight, and Cindy Young.

Other birds encountered during the trip were: Red-throated Loon, Pacific Loon, Common Loon, Piedbilled Grebe, Horned Grebe, Eared Grebe, Western Grebe, Clark's Grebe, Brown Pelican, Double-crested Cormorant, Pelagic Cormorant, Great Blue Heron, Great Egret, Snowy Egret, Wood Duck, Mallard, American Wigeon, Surf Scoter, Bufflehead, Ruddy Duck, Turkey Vulture, Osprey, Northern Harrier, Sharp-shinned Hawk, Red-shouldered Hawk, Red-tailed Hawk, American Kestrel, Virginia Rail, American Coot, Killdeer, Willet, Heermann's Gull, Mew Gull, Ring-billed Gull, California Gull, Herring Gull, Glaucous-winged Gull, Western Gull, Band-tailed Pigeon, Anna's Hummingbird, Black Phoebe, Steller's Jay, Scrub Jay, American Crow, Common Raven, Chestnut-backed Chickadee, Bushtit, Pygmy Nuthatch, Winter Wren, Golden-crowned Kinglet, Ruby-crowned Kinglet, Hermit Thrush, American Robin, Varied Thrush, Wrentit, European Starling, Hutton's Vireo, Yellow-rumped Warbler (both Audubon's and Myrtle), Rufous-sided Towhee, California Towhee, Fox Sparrow, Song Sparrow, White-crowned Sparrow, Dark-eyed Junco, Brewer's Blackbird, Pine Siskin, and House Sparrow.

Pelagic Trip to Cordell Bank, November 13, 1994.

At least five members of RROS joined Robin Leong and Napa-Solano Audubon (thank you for inviting us!) on this trip to Cordell Bank, Marin County. The trip leaders were Keith Hansen and Roger Marlowe. The seas were a little rough but smoothed out later in the day. We were offshore a long time (7:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m.). It was clear and cold early and late in the day. Highlights included: Black-footed Albatross, all colors of Northern Fulmar, good views of Short-tailed Shearwater, several gorgeous Black-legged Kittiwakes, Dall's Porpoise, Pacific White-sided Dolphin, close encounters with several Humpback Whales, and a blessed hour with two Blue Whales (one even pooped!). Other birds (and a fish) seen on this trip were: Red-throated Loon, Pacific Loon, Common Loon, Red-necked Grebe, Western Grebe, Clark's Grebe, Pink-footed Shearwater, Sooty Shearwater, Brown Pelican, Double-crested Cormorant (out at the Bank), Surf Scoter, Pomarine Jaeger, Bonaparte's Gull, Heermann's Gull, Mew Gull, Ring-billed Gull, California Gull, Herring Gull, Thayer's Gull, Western Gull, Glaucous-winged Gull, Common Murre, Cassin's Auklet, Rhinoceros Auklet, Tufted Puffin (only fly away looks), and Ocean Sunfish (Mola mola).
