

## **Coming Attractions**

Potluck and General Meeting. Thursday, May 11 - 6:00 PM at Sugarloaf Ridge State Park.

We plan to meet at the group campground (up the road past the picnic area and the stables). Bring your own service, drinks, and a main dish, salad, or dessert. Bring a flashlight if you plan to stay for the owl walk. The entrance fee is \$5 per car; \$4 if anyone over age 62 is in the car. In the unlikely chance that the group site is reserved, there will be a notice at the entrance on where in the park to meet.

**Field Trip to Pine Flat Road**. <u>Saturday, May 13</u>. Meet at 7:45 AM at the turnout approximately one quarter mile up Pine Flat Road (before the road starts to climb into the hills). If you arrive late, the group will start birding at the very top of Pine Flat Road. Bring a lunch and something to drink. There are no facilities. We hope to see Black-chinned Sparrow, California Thrasher, warblers, Purple Martin, Lazuli Bunting, and many spring birds. Leader is Ruth Rudesill (833–6026).

Field Trip to Lava Beds/Klamath Basin Area. Saturday, July 1 through Tuesday, July 4. We will be joined by members of Napa/Solano Audubon. Since the fourth of July is on a Tuesday, we will be up there for four days. Leader is Ruth Rudesill (707/833-6026). Ruth will drive up on the Friday before and will camp at Lava Beds National Monument. These campgrounds have running water, but no showers. Motels are available in Tulelake (Ellis Motel) and Klamath Falls, Oregon (Motel 6). Weather should be dry and warm and cooler at night. We will visit Lava Beds, Medicine Lake, Tule Lake and Lower Klamath NWR, Upper Klamath Lake area (Oregon), and Sky Lakes Wilderness (Oregon). Birds seen or heard in past trips include dancing and nesting Western and Clark's Grebe; American Bittern; Short-eared, Flammulated, and Great Gray Owl; Yellow Rail; Red-naped Sapsucker; Black-backed and Three-toed Woodpeckers; Franklin's Gull; nesting Prairie Falcon; Swainson's Hawk; Gray Flycatcher; Pinyon Jay; Gray Jay; Brewer's Sparrow; Black-throated Sparrow; and Green-tailed Towhee. If you are going to attend, you need to call Ruth at 707/833-6026. If you are staying at a motel, please let Ruth know which one. Also, anyone willing to go up on the Thursday before to hold campsites would be helpful. Car pool if you can!
