SOUTHEASTERN ARIZONA

Who would go to Southeastern Arizona in August to willingly encounter oppressive heat and spectacular "toad-floater" thunderstorms? The McDonaghs, John and Virginia. made the effort in order to attend both the Wings and ABA Conferences in Sierra Vista.

These events, held back-to-back, were highly organized, superbly staffed with experts in ornithology and highly competent local field trip leaders. The weather moderates during the monsoon at this time of the year and was tolerable, even pleasant at times.

Selected areas of the Santa Rita, Huachuca and Chiricahua Mountains, the Nogales area, along with the BLM complex on the San Pedro River were visited. A total of 149 bird species were observed. Highlights of these fascinating trips included: Lucifer and White-eared Hummingbirds, Rose-throated Becard, Mexican Chickadee, Northern Beardless Tyrannulet, Varied Bunting. Bronzed Cowbird, Buff-breasted Flycatcher, and Five-striped Sparrow.

All of these were "lifers" and were enjoyed immensely. A great trip and we are ready to go again to try for the Montezuma Quail, the Buff-collared Nightjar, etc.-----John & Virginia McDonagh

Phone Wheel

This is the new phone wheel. Please follow the following rules when using the phone wheel.

- 1. When you receive word of a rare or unusual bird, call the person whose name follows your name on the list (the last person calls the first).
- 2. Report the following information:
 - a. bird species (including age and sex information if relevent)
 - b. location (including directions of how to get there if required)
 - c. when the bird was seen
 - d. who found and identified the bird
 - e. who started the phone wheel
- 3. If you reach an answering machine, leave a short message so that the person can call back for details. Next call the following person on the list. Repeat until you reach a person who can pass on the information.
- 4. As a courtesy, try to phone the people you were unable to reach at a later time.

BIRD CENSUS AT MAYACAMAS MOUNTAIN SANCTUARY

Madrone Audubon Society, in co-operation with National Audubon Society, is developing plans to conduct a bird census at the new Mayacamas Mountain Sanctuary on Pine Flat Road. Censusing will begin in early 1996 and will continue for at least one year. RROS members as well as other interested individuals are invited to participate in this important endeavor

Volunteer orientation to the census methodology will be held at the Environmental Center of Sonoma County, 632 Fifth Street, Santa Rosa, from 9:00 AM to 12:00 noon on December 16, 1995, and will be conducted by a representative of National Audubon Society. Following the morning session, weather permitting, we will visit the Sanctuary to orient volunteers to the census areas. Bring lunch, water, field equipment and wear sturdy shoes for the afternoon session.

The census is being directed locally by Ken Wilson (823-8408) and Bill Payne (546-3331) as a project of National Audubon's Birds in the Balance program.

A legal challenge to stop the logging is combined with public education about the areal. The funds to acquire this land are being sough from private groups, public agencies, and the community.
