COMING ATTRACTIONS

Potluck and General Meeting. Thursday, May 9. Sugarloaf Ridge State Park at 6:00 PM. We will meet at the Group Campground (end of the road past the stables). The potluck dinner will begin at 6:00 PM, followed by the business meeting, and then the owl/poorwill walk. Comfortable shoes, a warm coat, and a flashlight are recommended if you wish to go on the owl/poorwill walk. The parking fee is \$5 per vehicle, so carpool if you can.

Field Trip to Pine Flat Road. Saturday, May 18. Meet at 8:00 AM at the bridge on Pine Flat Road. We will be looking for all the species that make this an exciting area to bird. Bring a lunch and dress appropriately. The leader will be Benjamin D. "Mike" Parmeter. Mike can be reached at 255-6757 if you have questions regarding this trip.

Field Trip to Lava Beds/Klamath Basin Area. Thursday, July 4 through Sunday, July 7. We will be camping at Lava Beds National Monument. These campgrounds have running water, but no showers. Motels are available in Tulelake (Ellis Motel) and Klamath Falls, Oregon (Motel 6). Weather should be dry and warm and cooler at night. We will visit the Lava Beds, Medicine Lake, Tule Lake and Lower Klamath NWR, Upper Klamath Lake area (Oregon), and Sky Lakes Wilderness (Oregon). Birds seen or heard in past trips include nesting Prairie Falcons, Yellow Rail, Franklin's Gull, Flammulated Owl, Three-toed Woodpecker, Black-backed Woodpecker, Cordilleran Flycatcher, Gray Jay, Pinyon Jay, Green-tailed Towhee, and Black-throated Sparrow. Well over 200 species are possible in this area at this time of year!! We have tallied over 170 species in the last two years. Mike Parmeter will be the leader. If you are going to attend, you need to call Mike at (707)255-6757. If you are staying at a motel, please let Mike know which one. Also, anyone willing to go up on the Wednesday before to hold campsites would be helpful. Carpool if you can.


PRBO ANNUAL BIRDATHON

Field Trip Report

Bodega Bay/Salmon Creek Road, April 20, 1996. Five birders enjoyed nice weather and birds at Bodega Harbor. Highlights included two Wandering Tattlers at Bodega Head, one Red-necked Grebe, a pair of Black Scoters, and a Peregrine Falcon in the harbor off Owl Canyon, and two Long-billed Curlews at Spud Point. Red Knots were searched for but not seen. The shorebirds were in nice breeding plumage. After Bodega Harbor, we continued on to Salmon Creek Road in search of spring migrants. Highlights here included 2-3 Golden Eagles and a Northern Pygmy-Owl. One Black-headed Grosbeak was heard. Participants were David A.
