

Saturday November 15th - FIELD TRIP to LOWER RUSSIAN RIVER AREA


Meet at the 1st bridge on Willow Creek Road out of Bridgehaven. Bring a

FIELD TRIP REPORT BODEGA HARBOR / SALMON CREEK ROAD OCTOBER 11, 1997

Fourteen participants enjoyed a partly cloudy and windy day at the coast. Highlights included: one Peregrine Falcon (anatum), 3 Red Phalaropes, 1 Red-necked Grebe, 2 Pacific Golden-plovers, 2 House Wrens, and a migrant flock on Salmon Creek Road with 2 Black-throated Gray Warblers.
