FIELD TRIP REPORT

February 14th trip to Grey Lodge area - This trip was led by Mike Parmeter who reported the group was unable to get to Grey Lodge due to flooded roads. They traveled from West Butte Road to Sacramento NWR only to find the driving loop closed as well. The group walked out the loop. The weather was partial rain and sunshine. 71 species were observed. There were seven participants: Jo Maillard, Herb and Linda McGrew, Mike Parmeter, Bob and Bertha Rains, and Kathy Vaslet.
