1974 SANTA ROSA CHRISTMAS BIRD COUNT.....

On Sunday, December 22, the 15th Santa Rosa C.B.C. was successfully conducted by RROS with Mike Panmeter serving as compiler. The day was clear with some wind before dawn. 125 species and 2 additional races were observed, with a total of 32,223 individuals recorded. Some notable observations included Prairie Falcon, Marbled Godwit, and Black-throated Gray Warbler, which had not previously been recorded on the Coast, and Horned Grebes, Redhead and Swamp Sparrow which had been recorded but once before.

Many thanks to all who were involved in the organization of the Count, and of the compiling session at Franklin Park Clubhouse.

Included in this issue is a table of the species and number of individuals for all 15 Santa Rosa Christmas Counts. Because of space problems, two pages were required for each species. By cutting and taping, these lists can be joined for convenience. The symbol (cp) means recorded during count period only, and (*) means the species was not included as a wild species until 1974.

DORAN BEACH ROAD SHORE BIRD STUDY.....

Gail Scott is a senior at CNCS doing an independent study project of shorebirds in the Doran Beach Road area. Here follows the second part of her study report:

This report includes the latter portion of November and the first three weeks of December.

As I stated in my first paper, printed in the December Kite Tales, the Dunlins outnumbered most of the other species of Charadriiformes. Since then their numbers have slightly increased from time to time, however, for the most part have remained relatively stable. The most significant change occurred in the Marbled Godwit population. By the third week of November their numbers had more than doubled. Stormy weather seemed to initiate their first population increase. However, subsequent fluctuations seemed to be correlated with tide levels in the bay. During low tides the great numbers of Godwits are concentrated on the bay side of my study area. A low tide at Bodega Bay exposes a great deal of mud, presumably, with an abundant food source for sandpipers and plovers.

Surprisingly the Western and Least Sandpipers are not quite as abundant as they were during the first month and a half. Both the Black and Ruddy Turnstones are becoming scarce and their familiar bickering-like call is now seldom heard.

Although my study consists mainly of the order Charadriiformes, Podicipediformes (Grebes) can also be sighted at my study area. Four species of Grebes, the Western, Eared, Horned, and Red-necked, will be found at the end of Doran Beach Road at the boat ramp just past the Coast Guard Station. If you miss them there, they may be seen off of Bay Flat Road near the mouth of the bay. The Common Loon may also be seen in these areas.

If you have ever had any second thoughts about Birding on a Friday the 13th, hesitate no more! As it turned out, the 13th of December fell on a Friday. The day started off as a Whistling Swan landed on the mudflat of my study area. This beautiful bird seemed out of place among the smaller sandpipers. Later I drove to Bay Flat Road to look for rails. I was very fortunate, sighting, for the first time, three Virginia Rails and two Scares. Continuing along Bay Flat Road several Common Goldeneyes were seen and a Red-breasted Merganser topped off the day!
