January 8, Thursday, 7:30 p.m.: RROS Meeting.

## RECORD CHRISTMAS COUNT?

On Sunday, Dec. 22, the 16th Santa Rosa Christmas Bird Count was very successfully conducted by RROS with Mike Parmeter serving as compiler. One hundred thirty-seven species, 2 more than previously recorded, were tallied by fifty-four hard working participants. Three species, Cattle Egret, Peregrine Falcon, and Willet were added to the all-time Santa Rosa C.B.C. list. All-time high counts were produced for no less than twenty-five species and eight other species tied previous highs. All this and it began raining at 2 p.m. There will be more complete details for this and other Counts next issue.

Many thanks to all those who were involved in the organization of the Count, and to those who supplied the reviving and delicious supper for the compiling session at Franklin Park Clubhouse.

Included in this issue is a table of the species and number of individuals for all 16 Santa Rosa Christmas Counts. Two pages were required for each species. By cutting and taping, these lists can be joined for convenience. The symbol (cp) means recorded during count period only, and (\*) means the species was not included as a wild species until 1974.
