FIELD TRIP RESULTS

Betty Burridge led 16 birders to Pt Reyes on October 12th to observe 78 species including Blackpoll Warbler and American Redstart.

The Bodega offshore trip on October 19th was blessed with good weather, good birds and a good turnout. Twenty-five species were seen from the boat including 4 Humpback Whales and 2 Dall Porpoises.

OBSERVATIONS -- by Mike Parmeter

A Common Loon was heard calling at Bodega Harbor on Oct 9 (Susanne Luther). Two Northern Fulmars were seen at the Cordelle Banks on Oct 19 (RROS). On the same trip ten Pink-footed Shearwaters, 75 New Zealand and 15 Sooty Shearwaters were seen (RROS). An Ashy Storm Petrel was near the Cordelle Banks also (Jon Winter, Benjamin D Parmeter). On Oct 6 at Monterey Bay, both Ashy and Black Storm Petrels were seen (BDP). An adult Green Heron was at the Rail Ponds at Bodega Bay on Oct 11 (Doug Ellis). Three Am. Bitterns were present in the east arm of Abbotts Lagoon on Oct 21 (BDP), as was a single Cackling-type Canada Goose (BDP). Dan Nelson saw a European Wigeon at the Muddy Hollow Pond at Limantour on Oct 10. The Cassini Pond at Duncan Mills had 3 male and 8 female Wood Ducks on Sept 25 (DE, BDP). A single Redhead was Bridgehaven on Sept 25 (DE, BDP) and 8 were seen along Black Point Cutoff on Oct 15 (Rick Lebadour). Tje Tufted Duck was seen at the Muddy

Hollow Pond on Oct 3 (DE). It was not there when looked for on Oct 20. Black Scoters had arrived at Salmon Creek on Oct 15 (DE). Common Mergansers were at Bridgehaven on Sept 25 (DE, BDP). An immature Ferruginous Hawk was studied at the Mendoza Ranch on Oct 12 (RROS). Two adult Golden Eagles were at Bridgehaven On Sept 25 (DE, BDP); one adult and one immature were at Salmon Creek on Oct 12 (Gerry Mugele); and one adult was at Novato on Oct7 (RL). A single Black Rail was heard calling at the Port Chicago marsh on Oct 8 (DE). On Oct 4, a Piping Plover was present in a flock of Snowy Plovers on the beach at Morro Bay (John Parmeter, John Sterling, BDP). A single Mountain Plover was in the same flock. Golden Plovers were seen in the field at the RCA Station on Oct 12 (Dave Shuford).

Three Red Knots were at Doran Park on Oct 10 (Sean Carpenter, Ruth Hawksley, Hal Corey). Five hundred Red Phalarope were present on the offshore trip on Oct 19 (RROS). Twelve Pomarine Jaegers were seen on the same trip, two with long central tail feathers (RROS). A single Sabine's Gull was seen on this trip (BDP) as well as a single Skua (JW). Three Elegant Terns were seen at Black Point Cutoff on Oct 6 (RL), and subsequently 50 birds were present there (DE). Two Xantu's Murrelets were seen on the Oct 19 trip (JW, DS, BDP). On Oct 6, 2 Craveri's Murrelets were seen on a Monterey offshore trip (JP, BDP).

A White-winged Dove at the new Willows on Oct 13 is an excellent record (GM). had been seen earlier this fall on two occasions. Three Saw-whet Owls were heard in the early a.m. on the Limantour Road on Sept 27 (DE, BDP). A Poorwill was seen near Palomarin on Oct 19 (DS, BDP). Three Poorwills were heard calling on Cavedale Rd on Sept 27 (DE). There were several sightings for Pileated Woodpecker, all from Sonoma County. A Tropical Kingbird was at Goleta, Santa Barbara Cty on Oct 16 (JS). A North Am. Dipper was seen along Austin Creek about 4 miles north of Cazadero on Sept 25 (BDP, DE). Birds have been seen at this location many times in the past. Two Red-throated Pipits were at the Santa Maria River mouth in Ventura Co. on Oct 18 (JS). A Philadelphia Vireo was at the Carmel River on Oct 21 (JS). Black-and-white Warblers were reported from the Carmel River on Oct 6 (JP, BDP) and from Goviota State Park on Oct 16 (JS). A Lucy Warbler was at Goleta on Oct 15 (JS). A single Tennessee Warbler was reported at the Nunes Ranch on Sept 27 (BDP, DE). An immature Magnolia Warbler was well studied at the lighthouse living quarters at Pt Reyes on Sept 27 (JW, BDP, DE). A Black-throated Green Warbler was seen at the Fish Docks on Oct 12 (RROS) and an adult male was at the Mendoza Ranch on Oct 19, 20, 21 (BDP). A Bay-sided Warbler was seen at the Mendoza Ranch on Oct 12 (DN). A male Black-throated Blue Warbler was at the Fish Docks on Sept 27 (JW, BDP, DE) and a female was there on Oct 20 (BDP). There were multiple reports of Blackpoll Warblers, with one being seen at Bodega Harbor on Oct 11 (Glenn Clifton). Palm Warblers were at Bodega on Oct 11 (GC) and another on Oct 11 and Oct 15 (DE). An adult male American Redstart was singing in the canyon on the west side of Bodega Harbor on Oct 9 (SL). A Blackburnian Warbler was seen at the Nunes Ranch on Sept 27 (BDP, JW, DE). A Red Crossbill was at the Pt Reyes Lighthouse living quarters on Oct 12 (RROS). Lapland Longspurs are back at the Hall Ranch in good numbers, up to 15 birds. They are easily seen, with the bulls' permission.
