FIELD TRIP RESULTS

January 10 was foggy and windy-not ideal birding conditions, bu 11 birders had an excellent day with spectacular looks at aPeregrine that posed both before and after lunch.

OBSERVATIONS --- by Mike Parmeter

Four Fulmars were seen from Bodega Head on 12-28 (LC Binford, BD Parmeter). A single adult Brown Pelican was present at Bodega Harbor 1-18 (LCB, John Parmeter),

a late, lingering bird. American were unusually numerous this winter. A single bird was noted at Clear Lake Stste Park on 11-20 (Ollie Kolkmann, Jim Matzinger). A White-faced Ibis was at Anderson Marsh on 1-2 (JM)! The number of swans and geese in coastal locations has been the greatest of any winter in my memory. I shall try to summarize the sightings submitted. Whistling Swans were noted as follows: 6 at Bodega Harbor 12-28 (ICB, JP, BDP), 18 at Salmon Creek on 1-21 (Doug Ellis), 11 at Lake Hennessey on 1-1 (JP,BDP), 3 at Anderson Marsh on 1-2 (JM), 5 at Bodega Harbor on 1-18 (LCB, JP, BDP). There were also many sightings for Canada Geese: 15 birds at Napa on 12-23 (JP), 17 birds at Napa on 12-23 (BDP), 2 medium sized at Bridgehaven (LCB, JP, BDP), 170 birds at Lake Hennessey on 1-1 (Jp, BDP), 8 birds (7honkers, 1 minima) at the Petaluma Sewer Ponds on 1-4 (Jules Evens, Phil Henderson, Mork Zumsteg), 30 birds at Bel Marin Keyes on 1-4 (DE), 15 birds at Port Sonoma on 1-4 (DE), 2 birds (both honkers) on Lakeville Rd on 1-4 (LCB, Dan Nelson, BDP), 1 bird at Doran Park on 1-13 (Ruth Hawksley, Hal Corey, Stan Carpenter, Les Hood), 1 medium-sized bird at Doran Park on 1-18 (LCB, JP, BDP). White-fronted Geese were reported as follows: 1 bird at the Napa Sewer Ponds on 12-23 (Phil Lenna, BDP), 8 birds at Bel Marin Keyes on 12-31 (DE), 6 birds (2adults 4 immatures) at the Petaluma Sewer Ponds on 1-4 (JE,PH,MZ), 5 birds at Anderson Marsh on 1-4 (OK), 7 birds at Bodega Harbor on 1-10 (RROS), 8 birds at Doran Park on 1-13 (RH, HC, SC, LH), 22 birds at Doran Park on 1-18 (LCB, JP, BDP). Snow Goose records: 6 birds at Bel Marin Keyes on 1-4 (DE), 1 adult, 1 immature at the Petaluma Sewer Ponds on 1-4 (JE,PH,MZ), 6 birds at Bodega Harbor on 1-10 (RROS), 2 immatures at Doran Park on 1-13 (RH, HC, SC, LH), 1 immature at Doran Park on 1-18 (LCB, JP, BDP), 1 immature at Bodega Bay on 1-21 (DE), 1 immature at Bridgehaven on 1-21 (DE). Ross Geese are always rare in Sonoma County, records for this period are: 1 adult at the Petaluma Sewer Ponds on 1-4 (JE, PH, MZ), 2 birds at Doran Park on 1-13 (RH, HC, SC, LH), 2 adults at Doran Park on 1-18 (LCB, JP, BDP), 1 bird at Bodega Bay on 1-21 (DE).

Blue-winged Teal, 4 males and 2 females, were at the Castroville Sewer Ponds on 12-31 (BDP,JP,LCB). European Wigeon were seen as follows: 1 adult male in Pope Valley on 11-26 (JM), 1 adult male in Richardson Bay on 1-3 (JP,BdP), 1 adult male at the Petaluma Sewer Ponds on 1-4 (JE,PH,MZ), 1 adult male on Clearlake Highlands Sewer Ponds on 1-4 (John Robeson). Seven Redheads at Spring Lake on 1-12 is a good number (DE) and a single female was seen at Salmon Creek on 1-18 (LCB,JP,BDP). A male Tufted Duck was found on the north shore of Richardson Bay near the sewer plant on 1-3 (JP,BDP). On Jan 2 a male Barrow's Goldeneye was on a pond on Stoetz Lane (RH,HC,SC) and was seen again on 1-10 (DE, Rick Lebadour). Three male Oldsquaws were at Moss Landing on 12-31 (JP,BDP, LCB), and a single male was seen on Richardson Bay on 1-3 (BDP,JP). A male Harlequin Duck in beautiful breeding plumage was next to Hwy 1 at Moss Landing on 12-31 (JP,LCB,BDP). Two male and 5 female Hooded Mergansers were at 5 Brooks Pond (RH,HC,SC) on 1-6. Twenty-five Common Mergansers were at Malchow Pool on 12-28 (LCB,JP,BDP).

Rough-legged Hawks began to show up after having been scarse in the fall and early winter. One was at Sears Point on 12-23 (RL) and another (possibly the same) was seen in the same area on 12-26 (DE). Single birds were noted at Bodega Head and Estero Lane on 1-18 (BDP,JP,LCB). Ferruginous Hawks were seen as follows; Pope Valley Airport on 11-26 (JM), near Napa 11-26 (JM), along Hwy 29 at Watson on 12-20 (JM) and at the Napa Airport on 1-18 (JP). There were many reports of Golden Eagles from inland and coastal areas. An immature Bald Eagle possibly a third year bird, has been near the mouth of Austin Creek for about a month. Several observers have reported it. Single Osprey were noted at Lake Hennessey on 1-1 (JP) and at Solano Lake on 9-9 (RH,HC,SC). Prairie Falcon

sightings were numerous with Jim Matzinger noting several in Lake County and No. Napa County. An adult female Peregrine Falcon has been at Bodega Bay for a couple of weeks and was reported by several observers. JM also noted several Merlins in Lake Co. He also submitted the single Sonoma Co. record, a single bird near Glen Ellen on 11-27.

Common Gallinules have been scarse in our area for several winters. A single bird was at Clearlake St. Park on 11-20 (OK,JM), and 2 adults were at the Petaluma Sewer Ponds on 1-4 (JE,PH,MZ). The bird which is regular at Kennedy Park in Napa is again present (JP). A flock of at least 51 Ruddy Turnstones was on the east side of Bodega Harbor on 1-18 (JP,BDP). A single Lesser Yellowlegs was reported, on Binford Rd in Novato on 1-4 (DE). Four Rock Sandpipers were at Bodega Head on 1-18 (LCB,JP,BDP). Numerous Red Phalarope were offshore at Bodega Head on 1-18 (LCB,JP,BDP).

A well-observed adult Glaucous Gull was seen in a mixed flock of gulls at Salmon Creek on 1-21 (DE). This is a most unusual sighting. Attempts should be made for others to see and, if possible, photograph this bird. One adult and 4 Immature Heermann's Gulls were seen at Bodega Head on 12-28 (LCB,BDP). Single Black-legged Kittiwakes were noted at Bodega Head on 12-28 and 1-18 (LCB,JP,BDP). Both Marbled and Ancient Murrelets were noted from Bodega Head on 12-28. On 1-18 only Marbled Murrelets could be found.

A Roadrunner was near Detert Reservoir on 11-26 (JM). This is Jim's 200th Lake County Bird! A Burrowing Owl was at the Clearlake Highlands Sewer Ponds on 1-2 (JM) and again on 1-4 (JM, Mary Manning). A Short-eared Owl was at the Petaluma Sewer Ponds on 1-4 (JE, PH, MZ). A Saw-whet Owl was heard at the Matzinger property in Cobb Valley on 1-3 by several persons and was heard again on 1-4 and 1-6 (JM, mob). Lewis Woodpeckers were reported from Butts Canyon Rd, High Valley (Lake Co) and near Napa. An Olivaceous Flycatcher was seen in Santa Cruz on 12-29 (LCB, JP, BDP) and an Eastern Phoebe was in Monterey on the same date (LCB, JP, BDP). On 12-30 a second Eastern Phoebe was found in Pacific Grove (LCB). A House Wren was seen near Clearlake Oaks on 1-4 (JM, MM), and one was at the Russian River near Austin Creek on 12-28 (Gerry Mugele, RL).

Black-andwhite Warblers were seen at Russian Gulch, Sonoma Co., on 12-27 (DE) and 12-30 in Pacific Grove (Rich Stallcup,LCB,JP,BDP). A Lucy Warbler was found in Pacific Grove on 12-30 by LCBinford and was seen by many others. Single Palm Warblers were at the Petaluma Sewer Ponds on 1-4 (JE,PH,MZ) and at the Monterey Presidio on 12-30 (BDP). On the Monterey CBC, in our (LCB,JP,BDP) territory, were a total of 11 species of warblers: Black-and-white (1), Tennessee (2), Orange-crowned (3), Nashville (3), Lucy's (1), Yellow-rumped, Black-throated Gray (1), Townsend's, Hermit, Palm (1) and Common Yellowthroat. A Northern Oriole (hybrid) was in Pacific Grove on 12-30 (LCB,JP,BDP). A Western Tanager was heard calling, but not seen on 12-30 in the Monterey Presidio (BDP). Doug Ellis reports 9 Evening Grosbeaks near Angwin on 1-1. The Parmeters saw a male and a female Red Crossbill together on Ink Grade, Howell Mt on 1-1. Rufous-crowned Sparrows are numerous this winter. Seventeen birds were counted around Lake Hennessey on 1-1 (JP,BDP).
