# OBSERVATIONS--Gerry Mugele

Horned Grebe at Lakeville Sewer Ponds on 5-9 (Doug Ellis, Dan Nelson, Betty Burridge). One Canada Goose near Lakeville Sewer Ponds on same date (DE, DN, BB). A Sonoma County breeding record was established on the same day, same place when a hen Pintail was seen with 5 young (DE, DN, BB). Lesser Scaup was at Bodega Bay on 6-5, 6-6--an unusual sighting for June (DE). Harlequin Duck on 6-13 at Sea Ranch (RROS).

Blue Grouse at Olmstead Point in Yosemite on 7-12 (Jean Smith, Hal Corey, Olive Corey). Atotal of 5 were observed (or heard) on 5-16 near Rockpile Road by RROS.

One Black Rail near the mouth of the Petaluma River on 5-9 (DE). Black Rails (21!) were counted by Doug at Port Chicago on 6-29. Ruddy Turnstone at Bodega Bay on June 7 (John Parmeter, Mike Parmeter, DE). Four Whimbrel at Bodega on 7-21 (Stan Carpenter, HC). Six Lesser Yellowlegs were at Salmon Creek on 7-31 (DE). One Red Knot at Bodega Harbor on 7-28 (SC, HC). One Baird's Sandpiper at Bodega Harbor on 7-28 (SC, HC). American Avocet on nest on 5-31 at west end of Frates Road, Petaluma (DE). Four young Avocets were seen in the same area on 7-1 (DE). This is a new county breeding record. Black-necked Stilts (35) were seen in the same area including many young (DE, JP, Phil Lenna). On July 15, Wilsons Phalaropes were seen at Bridgeport Sewer Ponds (HC, OC, JS). Sixteen were seen at the end of Frates Road on 7-1 (DE, JP, PH).

Elegant Terns were first seen at Bodega Bay on 7-28 (Roger Marlowe, SC, HC). Forty-one were seen on 7-31 (DE) with at least 20 remaining thru 8-17. A Least Tern was at Bodega Bay on 7-13 (DE). A Black Tern was at Salmon Creek on 8-17 (DE). On 6-7, Rhinoceros Auklets were seen off Bodega Head (JP,BDP). One Tufted Puffin was at the same place (JP, BDP). Twenty Tufted Puffins and 10-20 Rhinoceros Auklets were at Fish Rocks inMendocino County on 6-13 (RROS).

15 <u>Common Nighthawks</u> at Bridgeport Lake on 7-15 (H&OC, JS). <u>Red Breasted</u>, <u>Yellow-bellied Sapsuckers</u> nesting at Gualala River on 6-13 (DE, JP, BDP). <u>Busky</u>

Flaycatcher was seen at Yosemite on 7-11 (H&OC, JS). A <u>Gray Flycatcher</u> found by Doug Ellis at Owl Canyon on 7-31 is a county first.

Forty + Bank Swallows were near Glenn on 6-17 (JP, Terry Colborn, David La Follette). 3 Purple Martins 6-1 at Lurcerne (Lake County) (Joel Hornstein). 1 Gray Jay was seen at Van Damme State Park on 5-31 (jh).

Hermit & Wilson's Warblers were at Owl Canyon 7-31 (DE). An <u>Indigo Bunting</u> was on the Fort Ross Road (near Cazadero) on 6-14 (mob). <u>Pine Grosbeaks</u> were seen on 7-11 in Yosemite (H&OC, JS). <u>Gray-Crowned Rosy Finches</u> were at Tioga Pass on 7-12 (H&OC, JS). And Seven <u>Red Crossbills</u> were seen at McKerricker Beach State Park 5-31 (JH).
