FIELD TRIP RESULTS

After being rained out once, our intrepid voyagers got underway a week late...they braved the fog and headed up the Sonoma Coast. The following birds all count as Sonoma County birds. The Bodega Marine Lab boat was especially accomadating and everyone had a great time watching birds and whales.

OBSERVATIONS--Dan Nelson (762-6152)

One Red-necked Grebe was at the entrance to Bodega Harbor on 10-17 (BDP). The RROS pelagic trip on 10-17 was a great success. Our boat, "Stephanie", took us 20 miles off Bodega Head and all birds we found were in Sonoma County. One Black-footed Albatross, 2 New Zealand and 1 Flesh-footed Shearwater highlighted the Procellariiformes (MOB). A Northern Harrier was out of place at Sugarloaf State Park on 10-17 (DE). An imm Bald Eagle was seen at Tenelec, west of Sonoma, on 10-6 (GM). Another imm Bald Eagle was at Graylodge NWR on 10-24 (RS, LCB, JP, BDP). An ad Golden Eagle was at Sugarloaf on 10-17 (DE), another was seenat Clearlake Highlinds on 10-17 (DE), and a third (immature) was seen on Oct 19 over 101 south of Railroad Av in Cotati (RL). A Merlin haunted the north end of Spring Lake on 10-19 (RH). A Mountain Quail, rare along the coast, was heard calling in Willow Creek Canyon on 10-24 (ICB, RS, BDP, JP). A sub-adult Yellow-crowned Night Heron, accidental in California, was found at Año Nuevo State Reserve in mid September, and remained there for several weeks (BDP, DN, et al). A Common Gallinule was at the Chanslor Ranch pond on 10-7 (HC).

CHARADRIIFORMES

Fifty+ Mountain Plovers were in a field 1 mile east of Arbuckle, Colusa County on 10-24 (RS,ICB,BDP,JP). A Lesser Golden Plover was at Bodega Harbor on 10-24 (RS,ICB,BDP,JP). A Stilt Sandpiper was seen at Salmon Creek on 10-7 (HC, et al). Whether or not this is the same bird that was seen there 9-7--9-9 is a good question. Three Pectoral Sandpipers were at Doran Park on 10-13 (DE), and 2 were there on 10-18 (H&OC). One Pectoral was seen flying near Spud Pt on 10-17 (BDP,DN). This makes a total of 21 Pectoral Sandpipers in the county this fall, assuming no bird was counted twice. One Parasitic and 3 Pomarine Jaegers were counted on the October pelagic trip. Also seen were a single South Polar Skua, 3 Tufted Puffins and 3 adult Sabine's Gulls. Two Elegant Terns were at Bodega Harbor on 10-5 (HC,RH,SC). One Elegant Tern was near the old AGE Bldg at Vallejo on 10-24 (RS,JP,BDP,ICB). Elegant Terns were fairly common on SF Bay Throughout Sept and Oct (DN). A Black Tern was seen off of Willowside Rd on 10-29, Sonoma County's second this fall (DE).

The sub-adult <u>Spotted Owl</u> found on 9-26 at Russian Gulch was still there on 10-22 (DE,NC) and was apparently easy to see. Both <u>Spotted</u> and <u>Saw-whet</u> <u>Owls</u> have been heard from the Coleman Valley Overlook, and 2 <u>Saw-whets</u> were heard in Willow Creek Canyon on 10-24 (JP,BDP,ICB,RS). Five <u>Pygmy Owls</u> were heard at Sugarloaf on 10-17 (DE). A <u>Poorwill</u> was on Willow Creek Rd on 10-24 (BDP,JP,RS,ICB). This is rather late, but it is very likely that this

species winters within the county, only becoming harder to find. A Common Nighthawk was heard calling in Petaluma on 11-1, but was never seen (DN,WN). On 10-12, 300+ Vaux Swifts migrated over Petaluma and this flock contained 1 Black Swift (DN,WN). A Selasphorus sp. Hummingbird was in Owl Canyon 9-26 (DE). A Common "Yellow-shafted" Flicker graced the Rail Ponds on 10-25 (DN,Wn,MLR). Two Pileated Woodpeckers were at Sugarloaf on 10-17 (DE), and 9 Lewis' Woodpeckers were near Pope Valley on 10-13 (HC,RH,SC). One Lewis' Woodpecker was in Rohnert Park in early October (LCB) and about 20 were in Anderson Marsh, Lake County on 10-17 (JM).

PASSERINES

Two late <u>Barn Swallows</u> were at Anderson Marsh on 10-17 (JM). A <u>Rock Wren</u> was seen approx 1 mile north of Jenner on 10-5 (DE). Five <u>Townsend's Solitaires</u> were on Cobb Mt on 10-10 (JM,TL). <u>Golden-crowned Kinglets</u> have staged an invasion and have been found in all habitats throughout the coastal region (MOB).

PARULIDS

A Black-and-white Warbler was found in the willows along Laguna de Santa Rosa at Timber Hill on 10-15 (DE). A Tennessee Warbler was at the Fish Docks, Pt Reyes on 10-11 (BDP,JP,PL). A Chesnut-sided Warbler was at the Drakes Beach Monument on 10-4, and a Bay-breasted Warbler visited Nunes Ranch the same day (BDP,HMcG,LH). One Palm Warbler was at the Pt Reyes Lighthouse on 10-4 (BDP,HMcG,LH) and another was at Salmon Creek on 10-9 (HC, RH,SC). On 10-11, 2 Palm Warblers were at the Fish Docks and a single bird was at the Drakes Beach Monument (BDP,JP,PL). A Northern Waterthrush was behind the Rail Ponds on 10-19, establishing its 3rd county record (DN). At Point Reyes, a Rusty Blackbird was found in mid October, and both Chesnut-collared and Lapland Longspurs have been present on the Hall Ranch field. (MOB)
