The purpose of the trip is the Sage Grouse lek plus falcons, eagles, Sandhill Cranes, Longspurs and Northern Shrikes. Richard Merriss will be the leader.

Marin County Breeding Bird Project

From 1976-78, PRBO conducted a Breeding Bird Atlas project. The idea was to divide Marin County into 220 blocks and to have volunteers scour the country-side in the breeding season to determine all the species that breed in each block, and thus pinpoint the breeding distribution of each species. We are gearing up for the 1982 breeding season for one final push to cover the 10% of the blocks that have not been covered as well as fill in the gaps in a few other blocks. Volunteers are needed to spend a few days this spring looking for breeding evidence in these remaining blocks. This can be lots of fun as this is not a census, so you do not have to count individual birds, you just have to look for breeding evidence for each species. The project will culminate in the publication of the study which will include breeding distribution maps of all the species that breed in Marin.

February Field Trip Results

The following birds were of special note (from a total of 60 species): American Bittern, White-fronted Goose (20-low), Merlin, Sandhill Cranes (50-low), Shorteared Owl, Burrowing Owl, three species of Swallow-Violet-green, Tree, and Cliff. OBSERVATIONS--Dan Nelson (762-6152)

A Yellow-billed Loon was found at Ft Point in San Francisco, just below the Golden Gate Bridge in early February, and was seen by many people. A single Red-necked Grebe was near the jetty at Bodega Harbor on 2-18 (DE). 2 Green Herons were along Santa Rosa Creek off Willowside Rd on 2-20 (DE,TC). 7 Cattle Egrets were along High School Rd, Sebastopol, on 2-20 (DE,TC). An American Bittern haunted the Petaluma Sewer Ponds on 2-14 (KVV, KC). 2 Bluewinged Teal were at these ponds on 2-20, with 1 near there on 2-27. A single Ring-necked Duck was on a pond near Kenwood on 2-14 (DE). 4 female Barrows Goldeneye were at the Petaluma Sewer Ponds on 2-14, and one Hooded Merganser was there on 2-27 (both KVV, KC). 15-20 Common Mergansers were on Santa Rosa Creek off Willowside Rd on 2-29 (DE,TC). Early Osprey reports are from Spring Lake on 2-16 (RL), Bodega Bay on 2-18 (DN,WN,SG) and Monte Rio on 2-20 (DN,WN, SG). 1 Ferruginous Hawk along Arnold Drive/Olive Av on 3-3 (DN). A Merlin graced the Petaluma Sewer Ponds on 2-20 (KVV, KC). A Common Gallinule was at the Santa Rosa Creek off Willowside Rd on 2-20, and 2 Black-necked Stilts were there the same day (both TC,DE). A 1st year Glaucous Gull was found at Salmon Creek on 2-12 (KVV, KC). A Pomarine Jaeger and several Cassins Auklets were noted off Duncans Landing on 2-12 (KVV, KC). The first reported Allen's Hummingbird was in Petaluma on 2-14 (DN). The earliest Barn Swallow report was from the Bodega Farm Pond on 2-26 (HC). A Townsend's Solitaire was seen regularly throughout early February in Petaluma in Petaluma, but has not been seen recently (KVV,KC). The adult White-throated Sparrow was still in Kenwood as of 3-1 (DE).
