FIELD TRIP RESULTS

The September 18th field trip had a small turnout. The birding ranged from Pt. Diablo to Richardson Bay to Vallejo with the following results: (from a total of 90 species) a Rough-legged Hawk, 2 Peregrine Falcons, 2 Pectoral Sandpipers, a Northern Phalarope, a White-throated Swift and a flock of 300-400 White Pelicans.

OBSERVATIONS -- Dan Nelson (762-6152)

While land birding has been fairly calm so far this fall, offshore birding on Monterey has been rewarding. Good numbers of New Zealand Shearwaters have been seen, and the very rare Streaked Shearwater has also been noted. This bird breeds in Japan, Korea and China and has been found only 3 times off California. Also on Monterey Bay, Wilson's and Least Storm Petrels have been found in the large flocks of Black & Ashy's. 56 White Pelicans were seen in Bodega Harbor on 9/7 (HC,RH,CW,SC). A single Whitefronted Goose was at Bridgehaven on 9/25 (RL,RM). One Snow Goose was seen on Bodega Harbor on 9/24 (HC, CW, SC, RH). A Bar-headed Goose has been at Salmon Creek throughout the month, and is undoubtedly an escapee. A single Rough-legged Hawk was seen on the field trip to Pt. Diablo on 9/18 (RROS). A Prairie Falcon has been seen for the last few weeks near the Santa Rosa airport (RL,RM), and two <u>Peregrine Falcons</u> were seen near Tubbs Is. on 9/18 (RROS). A <u>Merlin</u> was seen at Duncan's Landing on 9/26 (DN, WN). Two Lesser Golden Plovers were seen in Bodega Harbor on 8/29 (DN, LCB). Most exciting was the Buff-breasted Sandpiper found at the Cader Ln. ponds on 9/2, which remained for several days (LUB, et.al). 2 Pectoral Sandpipers were at Salmon Creek on 9/26 (DN, WN). 9 Pectorals were at Richardson Bay on 9/25, and 2 more were at Bridgehaven the same day (both RL, RM). A single Baird's Sandpiper was at the north end on Bodgea Harbor on 9/25 (RL,RM), and 3 Baird's were at the Cader Ln. Ponds on 9/2 (DN). Elegant Terns have been numerous along the coast, and 12 were at Salmon Cr. on 9/26 (DN, WN). Two Spotted Owls were heard in Willow Cr. Canyon on 9/25 (RL,RM). Two Screech Owls were noted after the RROS potluck at Sugarloaf State Park on 9/9 (RROS). Two imm. Pileated Woodpeckers were found at Jack London Park on 9/27 (HC,RH,SC,CW).

LUMPS, SPLITS, NAME CHANGES are many in the 34th Supplement to the AOU Checklist and the 6th edition AOU due next year. This updated list contains all documented species of Canada and the U.S., including Hawaii.

Lumps: Tundra (Whistling & Bawick's) Swan, Dark-Eyed (now includes Gray-Headed) Juneo, Rosy (Black, Brown-Capped, Black-Crowned Rosy) Finch.

Splits: Manx & Black-Vented Shearwater, Yellow-Footed & Western Gull, Eastern & Western Screech-Owl, Common & Antillean Nighthawk, Yellow-Bellied (includes Red-Naped) & Red-Breasted Sapsucker, Tropical & Couch's Kingbird.

New names: Buller's (New Zealand) Shearwater, Tricolored (Louisian) Heron, Green-Backed (Green) Heron, Black-Shouldered (White-Tailed) Kite, Common Moorhen (Gallinule), Red-Necked (Northern) Phalarope, (Northern) 3-Toed Woodpecker, Black-Backed (3-Toed) Woodpecker, (Long-Billed) Marsh Wren; many others have American, Eurasian, Common or Northern added to old names, still other old names are now hyphenated.

Changes have been made in many other species which are lesser known to many of our members. Taxonomic order and scientific names are also greatly changed. Copies of the Supplement are available at \$3.00 each from G E Woolfenden, Biology, Univ. of South Florida, Tampa, FL 33620. I strongly urge you to send for one.
