March 25,26,27 -- Field Trip to Honey Lake

Motel reservations have been made for RROS on this weekend, but you must let Rick LeBaudour (525-9158) know if you are planning to attend as soon as possible. Call Rick for details. Plan to go on this tradtional RROS trip and see the Sage Grouse, Bald Eagles, Sand Hill Cranes, Falcons, Longspurs and Northern Shrikes. Rick will be the leader.

Much of the data for the Santa Rosa Christmas Count has now been updated and a list of all species found compiled. A total of 192 species has been found on count days, with an additional 3 species during the count period in the 23 counts since 1960. 70 species have been found on all counts with 94 on 20 or more counts, 100 on 16 or more counts and 121 on 50% of the counts. 22 species have been found only once. Highest total species of 139 were reached in 1979 and 1982. Highest total birds of 566,135 were found in 1975 mainly due to Starling flocks. 130 or more species have been found on 10 counts.

Christmas Count Trivia (Cont.)

This year's count produced new highs for 17 species (does not include those with total of one). Notable were Western Grebe, Double-crested Cormorant, Great Egret, Bufflehead, Sharp-shinned Hawk, Mountain Quail, Red Phalarope, Bonaparte's Gull, Rock Dove, Anna's Ummingbird, Black Phoebe, Brown Creeper, Wrentit, Hutton's Vireo, Hermit Warbler and For Sparrow (see January issue for totals). The only other years with this many high counts were 1975 and 1977. A new low for those species found on all counts was had by Common Snipe with 6. For the first time Common Moorhen (Gallinule) was not found either on the count or in the count period.

Some of the data produced include the above and also highs and lows for each species, number of counts for each species, and first year each species was found on the count. In addition, graphs are being prepared for the more common species to show their fluctuations of numbers over the years. ## OBSERVATIONS -- Dan Nelson (762-6152)

A Red-necked Grebe was in Tomales Bay near Marshall on 2/21 (DN). On 2/9, Doug Ellis counted 32 Double-crested Cormorants on Lake Ralphine and 30 more on Spring Lake, totaling 62. This number is twice that on the SRCBC, which was a new record at 31. A flock of 12 Common Mergansers were in Santa Rosa Cr. off Willowside Rd. on 2/10 (DE). I male and 4 fem. Hooded Mergansers were found near Valley Ford on 2/12 (C&DB). I male and 5 fem. Hooded Mergansers were on the pond at Five Brooks, Marin Co. on 2/12 (EN, MS). The Rough-legged Hawk at Sears Pt. was still there as of 2/17 (LH). A Ferruginous Hawk was near Marshall on 2/21 (DN, WN). An Osprey was seen at Spring Lake on 2/3 (H&OC). A Merlin was seen three different times in Glen Ellen during the month (G&KM). 14 Cattle Egrets were counted along Hwy. 12 east of Sebastopol on 1/25 (HC, RH,SC). 10 Tree Swallows were along Willowside Rd. on 2/10 (DE), and a single Tree Swallow was in Glen Ellen on 2/11 (KM). Early Violet-green Swallows were noted at Sonoma Marina on 1/23 (HC, et.al). A White-throated Sparrow visited the Biggs' yard near Sebastopol on 2/17 (C&DB). At least 1 White-throated Sparrow continues to visit the Kent Hall area of SRJC (DN), and the White-throated Sparrow in Petaluma was last seen on 2/28 (DN, WN).
