FLASH -- Big Day Results

RROS sponsored a group in the National Audubon Birdathon on Saturday, April 30 on their "Big Day". Just thought you might like to hear how they did. Using a small chartered airplane, Dr. L.C. Binford, Roger Tory Peterson, Don Roberson, Jeri Langham, Benjamin D. Parmeter and John Parmeter started at Imperial Dam, then to the north end of the Salton Sea, to Morongo Valley, to Big Bear City & Baldwin Lake to Monterey. They birded the Monterey area by car, ending their long day at midnight after owling Robinson Canyon. Their best bird for the day - a Semipalmated Sandpiper found at the north end of the Salton Sea. Results of their efforts - a total of 236 species: a new National Audubon and State of California record and tied the ABA record (When taking into account their 95% rule). Among the many members of the press was a reporter from Sports Illustrated (in his own small plane), so look for their exciting story in one of the next 2 or 3 issues. Congratulations:

FIELD TRIP RESULTS

8 birders enjoyed a beautiful day at Annadel State Park on Saturday, April 17th tallying 57 species. Some of the highlights of the day were: 12 Band-tailed Pigeons, Pileated Woodpecker (heard only), Hairy Woodpecker (pair at possible nesting site), Bushtits (at nest), Winter Wren (singing), Hutton's Vireo (with fledged young - very early), Solitary Vireo, Black-throated Gray Warbler and Yellow-breasted Chat (early).

NESTING RECORDS

Nesting records as of April 19th for the Santa Rosa or the Sonoma State campus areas: Mourning Dove, Anna's Hummingbird, Bushtits, Mockingbird, Starling, Scrub Jay and Red-shouldered Hawk. Observers: Dr. Jack Arnold, David Jensen & O.V. Slayden.

OBSERVATIONS -- Dan Nelson (762-6152)

A singleCommon Merganser was seen flying over Warm Springs Dam on 4/17 (DN). A Black Scoter was noted close to shore inside Bodega Harbor on 4/12 (RH,SC,HC). A Swainson's Hawk was seen near Rio Vista on 4/15 (DN). A Prairie Falcon was seen along Ida Clayton Rd. on 3/26 (HC,DE,TC et al). At least 3 Clapper Rails were heard from the bridge at Hudeman Slough on 3/29 (HC,RH,SC). A flock of 7 Lesser Golden Plovers were noted at the Spaletta Ranch, Pt. Reyes, on 3/23 (BDP,JP). 4 Wandering Tattlers were seen migrating off Bodega Head on 4/24 (B&BR,BDP,LH,HMcG). Reports of (Breeding plumaged) Bonapart's Gulls were numerous throughout the month at areas such as Bodega Bay, Salmon Creek and Black Point (MOB). A total of 14 Blue Grouse (of which only 3 were actually seen) were noted along Rockpile Rd on 4/9 (BDP,JP,PL,LH). 5 male and 3 fem.Sage Grouse were seen on the booming grounds north of Litchfield, Lassen Co. on 3/23 (BDP,BB). An early Vaux's Swift was noted just north of Novato on 3/27 (KC). 3 Pileated Woodpeckers were noted along Rockpile Rd. on 4/9 (JP,BDP,PL,LH), and another was along Franz Valley Rd. on 3/26 (DE,HC,TC,et al).

OBSERVATIONS (Cont.)

Western Kingbirds were seen along Rockpile Rd. on 4/17 and an Ashthroated Flycatcher was noted off Dry Creek Rd. also on 4/17 (both Madrone Audubon). An Olive-sided Flycatcher was heard calling in Wikiup on 4/26 (B&BR). A Solitary Vireo was singing along Rockpile Rd. on 4/9 (BDP, JP, LH, PL). The male Black-and-white Warbler was seen again at Stinson Beach State Park on 3/25, and is now in full breeding plumage (BDP, JP). The earliest Yellow-breasted Chat was seen at Annadel on 4/16 (RROS). A single Sharp-tailed Sparrow was at the traditional spot at the mouth of Pine Gulch Creek on 3/25 (BDP, JP). A Sage Sparrow was seen along Ida Clayton Rd. on 4/9 (BDP, JP, LH, PL). The singing White-throated Sparrows at SRJC were last seen on 4/21 (DN) and the one in Wikiup remained until 4/20 (B&BR). A single Lapland Longspur was noted at the Fleming Unit at Honey Lake on 3/23 (BDP, BB).


