FIELD TRIP RESULTS

Twelve people enjoyed a cool day of fine birding at Bodega Bay on Sept 10. No warm clothes were needed-beautiful, clear, calm day with temperatures in the high 70's. (Remember, it was 100⁴ inland). Highlights were a Jaeger (species) and a Virginia Rail and 2 chicks. The rails were really calling...about 6 rails (including 3 sighted). OBSERVATIONS -- by Dan Nelson

Four Red-necked Grebes were in Bodega Harbor near the Owl Canyon on 9-11 (DN). 2 Lesser Golden Plovers were at Doran Park on 9-6 (HC,RH,SC), and 1 continued there through 9-18 (RL). 4 Red Knot were at Bodega Bay 10-2 (RM.RL). A Pectoral Sandpiper was on the west side of Bodega Harbor on 9-7 (HC,RH,SC). A Sharptailed Sandpiper first found on 9-7 was apparently seen again on 9-22 along the SE side of Bodega Harbor (HC, et al). A Rufous-necked Stint was seen at the Bolinas Sewer Ponds on 9-25 (LCB, BB, DH). This bird is extremely rare in Calif and can be very difficult to identify in fall. At Bodega Bay, as many as 3 Parasitic Jaegers, 4 Common Terns, plus many Elegant Terns continue to be seen throughout the month (MOB). A Rhinoceros Auklet was seen off Bodega Head on 9-24 (BB). A Willow Flycatcher was in Owl Canyon on 9-25 (RL). A Yellow Wagtail was seen near Davenport in early Sept. This will probably become the first accepted record for this species in Calif. Two different Philadelphia Vireos were seen at the "New Willows" at Pt Reyes on 9-26 & 27 (LCB). Other birds LCB saw at Pt Reyes on 9-26 are: Prairie Warbler, Northern Parula, Black&White Warbler, 2 American Redstarts, Chesnut-sided & Blackpoll Warblers, Tropical Kingbird, Least Flycatcher(!) and Connecticut Warbler!! (Whewled.) An Ovenbird graced the trees near the Pt Rayes Lighthouse on 9-25 (TB). At the Sebastopol Sewer Ponds, a female Bobolink was seen on 9-22 (CT).

LATE REPORTS: At Pt Reyes (10-3), a <u>Philadelphia Vireo</u>, <u>Ovenbird</u>, <u>Palm Warbler</u> (BDP). On 10-4, at Owl Canyon, a <u>Broad-winged Hawk</u>, and at Salmon Creek 4 <u>Parasitic Jaegers</u> and a <u>White-faced Ibis!!</u> (JA,BDP).
