FIELD TRIP RESULTS - Tennessee Valley March 11

The field trip to Tennessee Valley-Marin Co. was well attended. Leader Betty Burridge reports she ran the crowd up and down the valley and up onto the ridge. Lots of tired birders that night! Lots of basic birds and early spring flowers were seen and Betty was happy to be able to introduce RROS members to a new birding area nearby. Species seen: Common Loon, Red-throated Loon, Western Grebe, Cormorant sp., Mallard, Canvasback, Lesser Scaup, Common Goldeneye, Red-breasted Merganser, Turkey Vulture, Sharpshinned Hawk, Red-tailed Hawk, Red-shouldered Hawk, Northern Harrier, Prairie Falcon, American Kestrel, California Quail, Killdeer, Western Gull, Great Horned Owl, Anna's Hummingbird, Allen's Hummingbird, Red-shafter Flicker, Downy Woodpecker, Black Phoebe,

Scrub Jay, Common Raven, Chestnut-backed Chickadee, Common Bushtit, Wrentit, Bewick's Wren, Robin, Varied Thrush, Western Bluebird, Ruby-crowned Kinglet, Cedar Waxwing, Starling, Yellow-rumped Warbler, Western Meadowlark, Red-winged Blackbird, Brewer's Blackbird, Purple Finch, House Finch, Pine Siskin, American Goldfinch, Savannah Sparrow, Oregon Junco, White-crowned Sparrow, Golden-crowned Sparrow, Song Sparrow. A total of 50 species.

NON-PASSERINES

At least 600 Black Brandt were counted in Bodega Harbor on 3/24 (RL). As many as 47 Cinnamon Teal were seen at Doran Park on 3/20 (HC,RH). Hooded Mergansers were still at Five Brooks Pond on 3/6 (D&LJ). On Rockpile Rd. Blue Grouse are calling, with 3 birds heard, and a male and female seen together on 3/25. Also heard in this area were Mountain Quail. (BDP,JA). 4 Lesser Golden Plovers were at the Spaletta Ranch, Pt. Reyes on 3/18 (JP,BDP). A single Black-legged Kittiwake was noted at Doran Park on 2/28 (HC,RH). A Pileated Woodpecker was found along Lake Trail, Annadel State Park on 2/24

<u>PASSERFORMES</u>

A Western Flycatcher and Orange-crowned Warblers were found along Coney Dr., Annadel on 3/4 (H&OC). An early Warbling Vireo was near Inverness Park on 3/18 (BDP,JP). In Petaluma, a Black-headed Grosbeak was noted on 3/24 and a Northern Oriole was found on 3/25, each beating its' earliest arrival date by several days. These birds may be expecting a warmer-than-usual summer (DN). The White-throated Sparrow at SRJC is still present and singing since 3/7 (DN), and the White-throated Sparrow in Petaluma is also still present, and was seen with a second White-throated buddy that arrived on 3/27 (WN). Another White-throated Sparrow, and occasionally two, have been visiting along Calistoga Rd. in Santa Rosa since 12/30 (JA).
