FIELD TRIP RESULTS - ROCKPILE RD. - April 14

A sunny warm spring day welcomed 25 RROS members and guests (a two group merger) which came together in the Blue Grouse domain. The first male Grouse was spotted high in a fir tree, alongside the road, a dark football-shape, perched quietly. The second male was hooting softly near our lunch stop, in the high hills, also way up in the top of a fir. For over an hour, sharp eyes and binocs tried to locate the bird and did! Both males stirred enough to show the orange comb over the eye - and allowed time for good, long looks by all watchers. Several other Blue Grouse were heard. Besides our target bird, among the species noted were: Black-shouldered Kite, Mt. Quail, Common Snipe, Vaux's Swift, Pileated Woodpecker, Western Kingbird, Tree Swallow, Rough-winged Swallow, House Wren, Varied Thrush, Western Bluebird, Cedar Waxwing, Hutton's Solitary and Warbling Vireos, Orange-crowned and Townsend's Warblers, Brown-headed Cowbird, Western Tanager, Black-headed Grosbeak, Lazuli Bunting, Lark Sparrow, Rufous-crowned Sparrow and many more, including a four foot Pacific Rattlesnake ---- but no Turkey!

FLASH!!!!...CALIFORNIA "BIG DAY" REPORT -- Sat., April 28

The National Audubon sponsored California "Big Day" Birdathon group, consisting of Don Roberson, Dr. L.C. Binford, Jeri Langham, John and Mike Parmeter took off from Yuma, AR at 12:30 a.m. in a Audubon chartered 6 seat, 2 engine Cessna and by 9 p.m. that evening had covered Imperial Dam, North end of Salton Sea, Big Morongo, Big Bear and Monterey (with a car waiting at each airport) and they now hold a new National Record of 243 species. (Old record-235). (Texas also had a Big Day, but it fell short - 222 species). Some of the

species seen were: Black Rails, Least Bittern, Solitary Sandpiper, Old Squaw, Cassin's Auklet, Williamson's Sapsucker, Swainson's Hawk, Vermilion Flycatcher, Lesser Yellowlegs and Saw-whet Owl... CONGRATULATIONS!!

OBSERVATIONS -- Dan Nelson (762-6152)

At Bodega Harbor, Brant were at their spring peak numbers with 720 counted on 4/17 (KC). A Blue-winged Teal was noted along Ramal Rd. on 4/25 (DE). Golden Eagle sightings this month were one at Monticello Dam on 4/4 (Madrone Audubon) and 2 imm. birds along Chalk Hill Rd., 4/27 (B&BR). A Merlin was seen at Sebastopol Sewer ponds on 4/1, and Blue Grouse were noted on King Ranch Rd. north of Cazadero the same day (both RM). A North American Dipper was seen along Austin Creek on 4/26 (DE, KC). Of special interst was the male Costa's Hummingbird seen briefly in Rohnert Park on 3/28, its' second occurance in Sonoma County (KC). A Pileated Woodpecker was noted at Annadel on 4/21 (Madrone Audubon). A Western Kingbird had arrived along Roberts Road on 4/10, and an Olive-sided Flycatcher was on Mt. Tamalpais on 4/21 (both KC). A Blue-gray Gnatcatcher was along Pine Flat Rd. on 4/27, along with many Warbling and Solitary Vireos (B&BR). An early Solitary Vireo was in Kenwood on 4/5 (DE). A singing Nashville Warbler was found on Mt. Tamalpais on 4/21 (KC). Hermit Warblers were noted along Ten Barn Rd. near Cazadero on 4/26 (DE,KC). Returning Black-throated Gray Warblers and Yellow-breasted Chat were at Annadel on 4/19 (KC). A Hooded Oriole was in Sonoma on 4/25 (DE). A Red Crossbill was noted at the town of Gualala on 4/5 and Grasshopper Sparrows had arrived at Lichau Rd. on 4/15 (both (KC). A White-throated Sparrow was in Kenwood on 4/4 (DE), and the Whitethroated was still in Petaluma as of 4/14 (WN).
