Also, 2 Fulmars, 3 Ashy Storm-Petrels, 25 Black Storm-Petrels, 1 Long-tailed Jaeger, 1 South Polar Skua, 15 Sabine's Gulls, 15 Arctic Terns (BDP&JP). 9/5, Bodega Bay - Rough-legged Hawk, Marbled Murrelet, 5 Virginia Rails, Black Shouldered Kite, Osprey, 2 Western Grebes & 57 Elegant Terns (Madrone Group). 9/2, Hwy 37 - 150 White Pelicans, 135 Long-billed Curlews (DE). 9/5, off Duncan's Landing - 100,000 Sooty Shearwaters (DE). 9/6, Limantour Estero, Good News! After 2 years the road is reopened. Red Crossbills, Baird's Sandpiper, Greater and Lesser Yellowlegs (E&BR). 9/8, Pt. Reyes Lighthouse - Fox Sparrow, 75,000 Sooty Shearwaters (LCB, BDP). Annadel - Western Tanager, pair Wood Ducks, Yellow and Wilson's Warblers (B&BR). 9/9, Cader Lane - 2 Baird's Sandpipers (BDP). 9/11, Bolinas Lagoon - 2 Pectoral Sandpipers. Five Brooks - Wilson's, Yellow, Townsend's Orange-crowned & Black-throated Gray Warblers (B&BR). 9/12, Owl Canyon - Winter Wren, Fox Sparrow. Off Bodega Head - Parasitic Jaeger (DE). 9/13, Wikiup - Willow Flycatcher (B&BR). 9/16, Bodega Bay to Cordell Banks Pelagic Trip - 10 Pink-footed, 4 Buller's and 50 Sooty Shearwaters, 1 Fork-tailed Storm-Petrel, 10 Pomarine and 2 Parasitic Jaegers, 3 Sabine's Gulls and 1 Arctic Tern (Boat full of birders). 9/18, Bodega Harbor - 75-2 year Heermann's Gulls, 1 Whimbrel (CW&HC). 9/19, Annadel - 5 Wood Ducks, 2 Pileated Woodpeckers, 5 Cedar Waxwings, Winter Wren,

Hairy Woodpecker (FB,HC). Pt. Reyes - 2 Prairie Warblers, American Redstart and Connecticut Warbler (DN). 9/22, Pt. Reyes - Green-tailed Towhee, 5 male Black Scoters (BDP). 9/23, Pt. Reyes - RROS Field Trip. Most interesting birds seen: Cooper's Hawk, Golden Eagle, Pectoral Sandpiper, Elegant Terns, Tropical Kingbird, Red-breasted Nuthatch, Prairie Warbler, 2 American Redstarts, Lapland Longspur and Black Scoters (BDP & MOB). 9/29, Hayward Regional Shoreline Park - Dusky Warbler - one of the very few North American records for this Old World Species (DN,LCB,BDP & MOB).


