COMING ATTRACTIONS

October 5, Saturday, Field Trip to Point Diablo; Dr. Monte Kirven, Leader

This is the month for migrating hawks over the Golden Gate Headlands...and assorted landbirds which funnel into these hills just west of Sausolito. Dr. Kirven is a biologist with Bureau of Land Management. We will carpool from Bailey Field Parking Lot, SRJC, at 9 A.M. Others can meet the group at Point Diablo at the first gun bunker at 10 A.M. To get there, take the last Sausolito Exit, just before crossing the Golden Gate Bridge, and head up the hill just west of Hwy 101. The gun bunkers are at the top of the rise. Parking is available at the first one on the left. In case the weather looks bad, call Monte Kirven Friday evening at 542-7512; he might reschedule for Sunday.

October 6, Sunday, Pelagic Trip to Cordell Banks

This trip will be led by Jules Evens, Kurt F. Campbell and Roger Marlowe. The "Stardust" will leave Bodega Harbor at 7:30 A.M. to explore the Banks and the adjacent continental shelf for seabirds, whales and dolphins. Many unusual species can be expected this time of year. FIELD TRIP RESULTS - Point Reves, September 15 - Doug Ellis, Leader

A clear, sunny day that started at the Fish Docks produced a few good vagrants for a dozen birders. They spent about an hour at the new willows watching an American Redstart, some immature Yellow Warblers, an immature Black-throated Gray Warbler (whose throat was still white!), a Western Flycatcher and a Bluegray Gnatcatcher. A family of three Great Horned Owls observed the birders from the cypress above the Fish Docks. Over at the Spaletta Ranch were a Solitary Sandpiper, a Baird's Sandpiper, some Pectoral Sandpipers, and a Buff-Breasted Sandpiper...and a grazing flock of Whimbrels with a couple of Longbilled Curlews...also a pair of Lesser Yellowlegs at the stock pond.
