FIELD TRIP RESULTS - Skaggs Island, Jan. 27

A large group of 25 birders, including Comm. Cosgriff of Skaggs Island, joined trip leader Faye Beeman for a great day of birding. The day started out with very heavy fog in the early morning, was clear and warm in the afternoon. A total of 61 species were seen: Eared Grebe, Western Grebe, Pied-billed Grebe, Great Blue Heron, Great Egret, Mallard, Gadwall, Green-winged Teal, Cinnamon Teal, Northern Shoveler, Canvasback, Lesser Scaup, Bufflehead, Ruddy Duck, Turkey Vulture, Black-shouldered Kite, Red-tailed Hawk, Rough-legged Hawk, Northern Harrier, Prairie Falcon, Merlin, American Kestrel, American Coot, Killdeer, Black-necked Stilt, Ring-billed Gull, Rock Dove, Mourning Dove, Great Horned Owl, Burrowing Owl, Anna's Hummingbird, Allen's Hummingbird, Black Phoebe, Say's Phoebe, Horned Lark, Scrub Jay, Long-billed Marsh Wren, Mockingbird, American Robin, Ruby-crowned Kinglet, Water Pipit, Loggerhead Shrike, Starling, Yellow-rumped Warbler, Common Yellowthroat, House Sparrow, Western Meadowlark, Red-winged Blackbird, Brewer's Blackbird, Brown-headed Cowbird, Blackbird sp. 
