No not her birthday... it's her report on her 650th ABA sighting.

I just came back from Washington State and yesterday had a great New Years! After two tries (2 hour round trip from my sister's house in southern Washington to the mouth of the Columbia River on the Oregon side) I finally saw the bird that has been eluding me (and California) for over 20 years - the Snowy Owl! This was bird #650 for me in ABA area.

The bird had been originally seen at the tip of the Clatsop Spit in heavy beach grass and stunted conifers but with New Years, people had scared it

away. I was told it had flown off 2 hours before we arrived. So I missed it on the first try.

My sister and I went back on New Years morning. We searched the spit but no luck and no other birders were there. We then went to the South Jetty parking area and found some other birders. The first one I asked said "Oh, it's on the beach. I just saw it" I ran to the beach but found nothing in the dunes area.

Then my sister saw two birders looking toward the surf. I assumed that they were looking for pelagics or something else but hiked toward them

Then a large snow white bird flew up from the beach and landed just on top of the sand off the breakers. He was beautiful and right in front of us!

As my sister and I celebrated a man approached me and said "Nice Barn Owl, huh?"
I turned as I recognized the voice - it was Dan Nelson!

He had been there earlier and got, hopefully, great photos. I hope they turn out.

Anyway, if you are thinking of chasing or know someone who is: The bird is located at Ft. Stevens State Park in Oregon near Warrenton across from Astoria from the east or north from Seaside. There is no entrance fee. Follow the road in until the South Jetty turns to the left where there is a large parking lot. The bird was on the beach north of the jetty but has been seen in the dunes all the way around the spit to the Columbia River side.
