Gray Lodge Wildlife Area Field Trip Report January 12, 2002

The highlights of this trip were several White-faced Ibis, a single blue phase Snow Goose amidst a large Snow Goose flock, two Blue-winged Teal, two Eurasian Wigeons, several Sandhill Cranes, one Short-eared Owl, three Lewis's Woodpeckers, two Rock Wrens, two male Mountain Bluebirds, and one female/immature Yellow-headed Blackbird. A total of 99 bird species was observed. 
An Open Invitation

Extirpated or Not?

Dr. Van Remsen, of Louisiana State University, has launched a search for Ivory-billed Woodpeckers, possibly sighted three years ago by turkey hunter David Kulivan. The search team going into the Pearl River Wildlife Management Area about 40 miles north of New Orleans includes two scientists, three woodpecker specialists, and an electronics expert. A combination of satellite imagery, aerial photographs, timber data, and the first-hand experience of some of the Planning Team members is being used to prioritize the 35,000 acres within the WMA in terms of likelihood of supporting Ivory-billed Woodpeckers.
