Coming Attractions

March 13, Thursday, 7:30 pm – General Meeting at Administration Building, Laguna Waste Water Treatment Plant – 4300 Llano Road, Santa Rosa "Birds of Sonoma County – Prelude to Spring Migration "by Mike Parmeter Join our own Mike Parmeter as he discusses common spring migrants in Sonoma County along with a slide presentation. Should be great for preparing for Spring 2003 birding!!

March 28-30, Friday-Sunday - Field Trip to Susanville Area for Sage Grouse We will spend 3 days birding the Susanville area in Lassen County. Our main goal will be to see the Sage Grouse lek at dawn on Saturday. Depending on road conditions, some pre-dawn walking may be required to get to the Sage Grouse lek. The River Inn (530-257-6051) in Susanville is the suggested hotel for this trip. Room rates are in the \$40-\$50 range per night. Some of our group will be driving up Thursday night in order to maximize our time in the area.

Bring binoculars, spotting scopes, field guides, food for lunches, and very warm clothing. Leaders are Alan Wight and Rick Lebaudour. If you are planning on going, please call Alan at 763-8572 (weekdays 7-9 pm or weekends any time) as last minute weather reports could cancel the trip, or if you have any questions.

Saturday, April 26, 7:30/9:00 a.m. - Field Trip to Mitchell Canyon, Contra Costa Co. This beautiful canyon on the slopes of Mt. Diablo is a great place to observe newly-arrived spring migrants. It's a magnet for less common migrating birds such as Hammond's Fly-catcher, Calliope Hummingbird, Nashville Warbler, and Hermit Warbler. Along with the birds come a nice variety of butterflies, reptiles, and wildflowers. Meet at 7:30 a.m. at the Petaluma Park-and-Ride for carpooling or meet at the Mitchell Canyon parking lot at 9:00 am. This Park -and-Ride is located on Lakeville Highway in Petaluma just west of US101. To get to Mitchell Canyon, take Highway 680 south to Walnut Creek. Take the Ygnacio Valley Road exit east (this exit may only be available going north, you may have to turn around after passing Walnut Creek). Once on Ygnacio Valley Rd, drive east 7.7 miles and turn south on Clayton Rd. Drive one mile and turn right onto Mitchell Canyon Road. Follow this road for 1.6 miles to the end. Bring binoculars, hiking shoes, water, and a lunch. We will walk about three miles at a leisurely pace. Leader is Alan Wight. Please call Alan (weekdays 7-9 pm or weekends any time) at 763-8572 if you plan to meet the group at Mitchell Canyon or if you have any questions.

Lake Berryessa Field Trip Report - January 25, 2003

We enjoyed beautiful weather and nice views of the Lake Berryessa area. The bird highlights were two Lewis's Woodpeckers (in Pope Valley), at least five Bald Eagles, two Golden Eagles, a distant Prairie Falcon, two Peregrine Falcons soaring high above the Lake Berryessa dam, two Spotted Sandpipers, and at least 31 Hooded Mergansers. Shollenberger Park and Skaggs Island Field Trip Report - February 22, 2003

In the morning we hiked the loop at Shollenberger Park and observed over a dozen Blue-winged Teal, one male Redhead, an adult Golden Eagle, an early Barn Swallow, a brief glimpse of an American Bittern, a repeatedly calling Black Rail, and one locally unusual Chestnut-backed Chickadee. In the afternoon, Dick Ashford led us around Skaggs Island where we saw numerous White-tailed Kites and Northern Harriers, two Rough-legged Hawks, at least five Golden Eagles, a Prairie Falcon, at least 11 Short-eared Owls flying at once, several newly-arrived Allen's Hummingbirds, and a juvenile intermediate morph Swainson's Hawk. The Swainson's Hawk was first found and identified by Dick in the morning. Our group was able to study it in flight for quite some time. This is one of very few records of Swainson's Hawk in Sonoma County.
