Observations

Per the August 2003 *Petaluma Post*- Bob Dyer reported a new egret and heron colony across the river from Shollenberger Park. The birds arrived in April, and by July 14th Dyer and Len Nelson counted 29 nests with combined 47 nestlings. This colony was viewed from trail markers #8 and #9. This colony was in eucalyptus trees and had Great Egret (18 nests with 31 chicks), Snowy Egrets (9 nests and 12 chicks), and Great Blue Herons (2 nests and 4 chicks).

This site was designated Shollenberger Petaluma River #121 by the Heron and Egret Project.
